Finding God ...

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

On behalf of my Mom and brother, I thank you for the many kindnesses, prayers and Masses offered for my Dad upon his passing on August 31. I have been blessed to be raised by a truly good father and humble, hardworking man. I pray that many of his virtues remain a part of who I am as a priest and spiritual father to you.

Many years ago, during the pandemic, I used to keep a daily blog that I would email to the parishioners of the church to which I was assigned so as to offer a spiritual reflection in the midst of that challenging time for all of us. One of those entries focused on the re-opening of the marina where my Dad kept his boat and spent many hours both fishing, and I imagine, pondering life.

At the time, I wrote this: "[Reopening the Ridley Marina] is a small moment of hope during Covid, and for that I am grateful. My Dad has never been a church-goer, not since his early teens. I never explored that topic with him, and I'm not sure why. The faith journey for each of us is so personal, isn't it? I guess it's just hard to ask why someone doesn't love something in the same way that you do.

"I mention this," I continued in the blog post, "because although his last church appearance was at my ordination, I often wonder if my Dad just doesn't find God in Church. I used to struggle with that; now, not so much. In light of the pandemic, I am beginning to realize that perhaps my Dad – like all of us – is finding God in places and ways that I, the Church-goer, wouldn't have always recognized or approved. Perhaps my Dad has found God along the Darby Creek. Or better yet, maybe that is where God is finding my father.

"The calming effect of being on the water ... the peaceful silence that comes while fishing ... the setting sun on a summer evening: all are ways, perhaps, that the Lord speaks to my father's heart in a way a Church sermon or a novena never could. That's not to say I don't pray daily for my Dad to desire and return to liturgy and church community one day, but at least for now, I take comfort in the fact that my Dad's heart can seek the peace of God he finds in some small, mysterious way on that tiny boat he docks along the "crick" that runs through his hometown. In the end, that's what life's journey may be all about: allowing God to reach us in love wherever we find ourselves."

As we gather this Sunday to celebrate the Exultation of the Holy Cross as a parish family, may we never forget how much our Heavenly Father loves us, so much so that He sent His only begotten Son so that whoever believes in Him may have eternal life. May we all allow that Love to find us – wherever we may be – so that we all one day live in the light of eternal glory.

First Reading: Amos 8:4-7

The prophet Amos expressed disgust over people who take advantage of the poor. He describes businessmen scheming to cheat the poor, then declares that God will "never forget the things they have done."

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 2:1-8

Paul urges the Christians to pray for all people, especially those in authority. Paul even asked them to pray for the kings who denounced Christ's teachings, because God wants all people to be saved through Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 16:1-13

Jesus tells a story about a servant who tries to cheat his employer. The owner is impressed because he would do the same thing himself. Jesus then describes the importance of being trustworthy in small matters, as well as in greater ones. He then states that no one can serve two masters faithfully, so people cannot give themselves completely to both God and money.




