**REFLECTION**

*September 21, 2025*

**The Praying Padre...**

Stories abound of the miraculous intercession of St. "Padre" Pio of Pietrelcina (Italy), both while he was a Capuchin Franciscan friar and even in the decades following his death in 1968. American soldiers during World War II tell tales of the brown-robed priest who could read their souls as they came to him for Confession; a mother about to give birth during a very difficult pregnancy shares the story of how Padre Pio appeared in her hospital delivery room and blessed her even though he was hundreds of miles away and never left the monastery; a local mom who recently visited the Padre Pio Shrine in South Jersey has reported miraculous healings for her son whom doctors declared wouldn't live more than a few hours after his birth.

All of this points to the fact that the saints who have gone before us continue to walk with us on our journey through life. As we know, they pray for us constantly before the Throne of God and desire nothing more than our holiness. Pio, Bernadette, Francis de Sales, Therese and so many other holy women and men promised that once they returned Home to our heavenly Father, they would be even more attentive to the prayers and cries of those who seek the Lord's mercy and healing. Perhaps most beautifully, they help us embrace God's will for our lives through their own witness of faithful discipleship.

This coming week, the Church celebrates Padre Pio's feast on Tuesday the 23<sup>rd</sup>. Perhaps one of my favorite quotes/prayers from the holy friar is this: "My past, O Lord, to Your mercy; my present, to Your love; my future, to Your providence."

St. Padre Pio, pray for us.

## Readings for Next Week: Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### First Reading: Amos 6:1a, 4-7

Amos denounces the selfish attitude of those who surround themselves with luxuries with no concern for others. He goes on to warn that because these people lacked interest in the state of their society, they would be the first to be exiled.

### Second Reading: 1 Timothy 6:11-16

Paul tells Timothy to seek integrity, faith and love. Paul urges him to attain everlasting life by maintaining strong faith in Jesus and in God until Jesus returns.

### Gospel: Luke 16:19-31

Jesus tells of a rich man who feasted daily, while a beggar named Lazarus went hungry outside his gates. When both men died, Lazarus was taken to Abraham, but the rich man was in torment. When he begged for mercy, Abraham reminded him that Lazarus had lived in torment, while the rich man lived in selfish luxury. The man then asked if Lazarus could be sent to his brothers to warn them. But Abraham said if they had not heeded Moses or the prophets, they would ignore even the warning of one risen from the dead.

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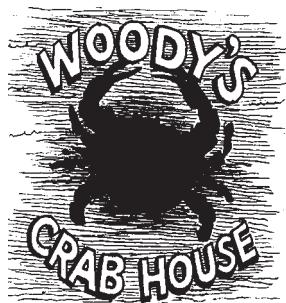

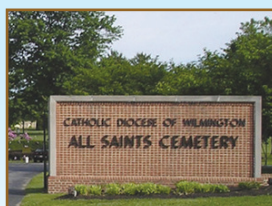
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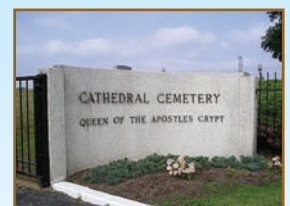
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
