#### REFLECTION

#### My Favorite Week ...

I mentioned before in past bulletin reflections that this coming week is my favorite week of the liturgical year. Yes, Holy Week is beautiful and the Christmas octave quite special, but this week ahead? We have heavy-hitting Archangels (Monday the 29th); a Bible-translating scholar known for his crankiness (St. Jerome on the 30<sup>th</sup>); the Little Flower St. Therese on Wednesday October 1; the celebration of our own guardian angels on October 2 and then St. Francis of Assisi on Saturday the 4th. All of these unique feasts speak to the incredible universality and variety found within the Catholic Church: there's something here for everyone collectively and for each of us as individuals. Angels and saints point to the eternal presence of the God who loves us beyond all telling and wants us to be in relationship with Him and with one another. In a society that often seems rather directionless and lacking peace these days, it is both a blessing and a comfort to know that there are angels that surround us and saints who have shared in similar life journeys who intercede for us and cheer us on as we make our way back to the Father. I truly don't know where I would be without them in my life.

As we remember these feast days, please consider joining us for some holy moments at the parish this week: On **Friday evening (Oct. 3) at 6:30 pm** in the ballfield at Immaculate Conception Church, we will once again offer blessings to all creatures great and small in the same way that the holy friar from Assisi once glorified God in all His four-legged and winged works. (I'm not so sure about the slithering and spidery ones, though!)

Then, on **Saturday, October 4 at 11:00 am**, we will gather as a community during Respect Life weekend to honor the innocent lives tragically taken from us as a result of abortion. So many of our parishioners these past six decades (and then some) have done so much to care for women who experience crisis pregnancies. May we continue to be a reminder for the world to know that the Catholic Church will always be a voice for the unborn and will do all we can to help mothers find the care and support they need to bring a precious child into the world. *Please note that Saturday's Respect Life Mass will take place at 11:00 am at Immaculate Conception Church*. There will not be a daily Mass at 8:30 am on October 4th. Confessions will be offered beginning at 9:00 am.

St. Therese of Lisieux, the Carmelite nun who promised to spend her heaven doing good on earth, has a powerful quote that I often try to remember as I go about my days: "Remember that nothing is small in the eyes of our Lord. Do all that you do with love."

Enjoy my favorite week ahead. My prayer is that it might become one of your favorites, too!

#### Readings for Next Week: Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4

The prophet Habakkuk cries out despairingly to God because of the state Jerusalem has fallen into. He asks why God does nothing to stop the violence and misery. God assures him that a time will come when only the just and faithful will live.

#### Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14

Paul writes to Timothy from prison and urges him to continue to spread the gospel without fear or shame. He also tells Timothy to draw upon the strength of the Holy Spirit to help him face the hardships he will encounter while preaching.

#### **Gospel: Luke 17:5-10**

The disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus replies that "faith the size of a mustard seed could transplant a sycamore," indicating that a person either has faith, strong and complete, or none at all. Jesus also explains that a servant will not receive gratitude for simply following his master's orders. In the same way, we are all God's servants doing no more than our duty when we obey God's commands.


