REFLECTION

Remembering ...

This coming Thursday marks the 24th anniversary of the 9/11 terrorist attacks. A Boston mother who lost her 25-year-old son that day in the Twin Towers came to speak at a Villanova University lecture on the 10th anniversary of the tragedy. I will never forget her words: "As a Mom, I still grieve every day for my Tommy (her son), but I will not let hatred conquer my heart. It's not how he would want me to spend the rest of my days."

I think of that mother's quote every time I visit the campus chapel at Villanova and happen to come upon the stained glass window commissioned by the university to commemorate the 15 alumni who perished that day in New York, Washington and western Pennsylvania. The artist, an Augustinian friar, captures the locations of the attacks in one pane of glass with the names of the deceased alumni etched at the bottom. In the other pane, however, stands Our Lady of Sorrows, her arms open and her head slightly bowed in both grief and prayer. As our Mother, she forever stands at the foot of our modern-day Crosses, saying to all: "I will never leave your side as you journey through this valley of tears."

This week, as we pause to remember the 9/11 anniversary as well as continue to pray for the Annunciation parish and school community in Minneapolis, may we keep close to our hearts the Mother of Sorrows (feast day – September 15), she who is God's gift to us as we grieve life's tragedies, both great and small. Believe it or not, it was talk show host Stephen Colbert who once said on his program to another guest: "It's comforting to know we have a God who understands us because He and His Mother suffered, too."

After hearing the prayers of Moses for his people, the Lord instructed Moses to cure those who became ill with a bronze serpent mounted to a pole for them to see.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

In this letter to the Philippians, Paul tells us how Jesus set aside his form of equality to God and took on a humble, human form - obedient even unto death. God the Father greatly exalted Jesus because of this.

Gospel Reading: John 3:13-17

As today's first reading tells us of Moses raising the bronze serpent in the desert for those to be cured, Jesus says, too, that the Son of Man should be lifted up for all to see so the world might be saved, and he who believes in him might enjoy eternal life.
