




Gulf Breeze Charter Night





OCALA LIONS CLUB CONTINUES KIDSIGHT PROGRAM

The KidSight Program in Ocala has been supported by the Ocala Lions Club since 2014. During that time, over 14,000 children have been screened. The program has made a difference in the lives of young children. KidSight is a free vision screening program administered by the Florida KidSight Foundation and Lions Club volunteers. It detects vision problems that can cause Amblyopia (lazy eye) in children between the ages of 1 and 6 years of age. The Ocala Lions Club has made a major commitment to the program this year and recently purchased two new State-of-the-Art Plusoptix S20 cameras. Rebecca Christianson, representative for Plusoptix, came to Ocala Lions Club meetings to share information about the cameras and their benefits. There was also a special trade-in program offered by the company and support is provided.

Ocala Lions Club members go to local preschools and screen the children. The cameras are used to create an image of the children's eyes. The camera will recommend a referral if a problem is detected and parents/guardians are notified. The Ocala Lions Club KidSight program is being run this year by Lion Kristi Hannen with assistance from Lion Peter Palermo and Lions Jim & Lions Tricia Evans. The Orange Park Lions knew the last week in September was going to be a challenging week to serve the community, but the Lions came out roaring for 3 events in 5 days. Their first project was to serve at the Impact Clay Train in Keystone Heights on a hot Saturday. The Lions are no stranger to this monthly event haven served several times all over the county. This was the second Impact Clay Train where the Lions did what they do best, vision screening. The Lions Club is all about vision as screenings were performed on dozens of children and adults. Results were given and if needed, information was offered on how to get additional vision assistance and aid with eye exams and glasses. Lions Erika Gilbert, Kitty Minor, Don Minor, and Mike Poweleit provided the screenings in addition to handing out pencils, sunglasses, and baby toy lions. On this day, in addition to the screenings, at the Clay Train, 141 people were served, with the help and support of 57 volunteers including the 4 Lions. Three days later, it was time to help at one of the biggest Lion events of the year, "Sight for Kids Spooktacular". Over 600 kids from Boys and Girls Clubs of Northeast Floria got ready for Halloween. It was a day of fun at EverBank Stadium for the kids who also received vision screenings.
