

"Vocation to Priesthood . . . Marriage Vocation" is our teaching in RCIA this Wednesday. It is based on the teachings of 1 Samuel 3 and John 1 (35-42). Samuel heard his name called many times but didn't know who it was who was calling him. He wanted to know who had spoken his name so Eli, his friend and teacher, helped him learn it was God who was calling him.

Why did it take Eli to reveal to Samuel that it was God calling him? Most likely, it was because Samuel did not know the Lord, so he didn't recognize his call. In Scripture, we read of many others who were called by the Lord: John the Baptist didn't recognize Jesus as *the Lamb of God*. Andrew told Peter, his brother, that in Jesus he had found the Messiah everyone had been waiting for. When Mary came to her cousin, Elizabeth's aid, Elizabeth cried out, "How is it that the mother of my Lord had come to me . . . the moment I heard your greeting, the baby leapt in my womb!"

Will we recognize Jesus when he calls us? How long will it take for us to become familiar with the Lord? Although we are saved by faith in Jesus, we have been given so many gifts to come to know and love him more — the Holy Spirit, the Church, the Bible, the traditions handed down to us by the Apostles, the lives of those declared saints by the Church the examples of our parents and others who have revealed Jesus to us.

God knows each one of us *intimately!* He knows us each by name. When Samuel finally came to know that it was the Lord who was calling him, he replied, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." As we begin to listen more for the Lord's call, we, too, will see Jesus as the Lamb of God and we, too, will recognize him as the Messiah. We will begin to recognize that, because we love him, we will learn more each day of our lives about his call to us and his desire for us to live a life of service to others, but especially to those who have no voice, those who are poor and those who are neglected.

RCIA, the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is the Church's journey of faith for those who wish to become Catholic through Baptism, or for those who, if Catholic, can prepare to receive the remaining sacraments of full initiation into the Catholic Church: Confirmation and First Communion. We meet every Wednesday from 7-9 pm in the Religious Education Center. We prepare all teachings through a Lectionary-based Catechesis which offers those attending a chance to grow through Scripture and the Mass. RCIA also offers fellowship with other adults as they meet to prepare to learn the Catholic faith.

We also meet with children for the Rite of Initiation for Children every Wednesday evening from 7-8:30 in the same location. Those children ages 7-13 whose parents want them to be baptized are taught by Catechist, Mary Ann Vigil. Please call Ben Esquibel at 505-927-6728 if you have any questions about the RCIA journey.

SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

The newly restored Jerusalem of Isaiah's time radiated the Lord's glory, attracting men, women, and families from lands afar. From Midian, Ephah, and Sheba they came, caravans of foreigners braving the lengthy journey for they could experience for themselves the splendor of the holy city and praise God. Centuries later other foreigners journeyed to the region, also led by a radiant light, also bringing gold and frankincense, also coming to do homage to the Lord. Like the residents of Midian, Ephah, and Sheba, the magi were not only foreigners but Gentiles, outsiders in Jerusalem and neighboring Bethlehem, but as Paul later asserted, coheirs to the promise in the newborn babe they came to see. Though they were not welcomed sincerely by Herod, the magi were warmly welcomed by the Holy Family, just as Jerusalem welcomed foreigners centuries earlier. On this feast of the Epiphany, this celebration of the manifestation of the Lord to the entire world, we are tasked with reflecting the light of Christ to all, welcom-



ing even those who live beyond our horizons. In so doing, we are given a new horizon, a way past the limits we impose on ourselves or on others, via this light of Christ, now within us, which shines forth to the whole world.

What happened when Jesus was baptized?

We have accounts of Jesus' Baptism in all three Synoptic Gospels:

Matthew 3:13-17 — Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to John, to be baptized by him. John would have prevented him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me? But Jesus answered him, "Let it be so now; for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Then he consented. And when Jesus was baptized, he went up immediately from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove, and alighting on him; and lo, a voice from heaven, saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased."



Mark 1:9-11 — In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And when he came up out of the water, immediately he saw the heavens opened and he Spirit descending upon him like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, "Thou art my beloved Son; with thee I am well pleased."

Luke 3:21-22 — Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form, as a dove, and a voice came from heaven, "Thou are my beloved Son; with thee I am well pleased."
