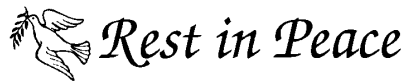

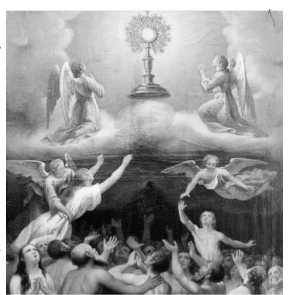

SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS: In today's Gospel we hear Jesus preach the Beatitudes, those wonderful blessings God imparts upon those whom many view as less fortunate. One of the lessons of the Beatitudes is that all of us are already blessed. Those who make peace, Jesus says, will be called God's children, but listen to John's words in the second reading: "See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God" (1 John 3:1). We are already God's children. Similarly, God has already shown mercy again and again, has comforted us in our sorrow, has given us the land as our inheritance as part of the act of creation. Most importantly, Jesus has won salvation for us, enabling us all to inherit the kingdom of heaven. Those whom we regard as saints understand this. They willingly live out the Beatitudes, becoming poor in spirit and clean of heart, living meekly, treating others with mercy, and accepting derision and persecution in order to follow God's will. In doing so, they reveal the kingdom of heaven to the rest of us. May we follow their example. **As a child of God, what will you do to reveal God's blessings to others?**



THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Wouldn't it be wonderful to take a class where the teacher reveals that everything we need to know can be summarized in just two sentences? What an easy final exam that would be! In today's Gospel, Jesus, our Teacher, does just that, telling the Pharisees—sticklers for all 613 commandments written in the Torah—that all of the law and the prophets depends on just two commandments: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind" and "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37,39). He's right, of course. If you love God and love your neighbor this way, you will want to follow every other command that can be found in either Testament, Old or New. As long as we keep in mind that we all are made in the image and likeness of God, that Jesus chose to redeem us all, and that the Holy Spirit dwells within us all, then we will want to love God and our neighbor with all our strength, for in loving one we are loving both. Jesus gave us the answer and a model. Let us, as Paul says, be imitators of the Lord.

When have you found it difficult to recognize God's presence in your neighbor? How can you overcome this?

RCIA “Love of Neighbor . . . Imitation of Christ” was our teaching in RCIA this past Wednesday. The greatest commandment given by Jesus himself is: “. . . *you shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, with your whole mind and with your whole soul . . . and you shall love your neighbor as yourself.*” Later on in Scripture, Jesus tells us, “*You shall love one another as I have loved you.*”

Jesus teaches us that to follow him means we must obey these commandments if we are to be true followers of Jesus. The way we know we love God is in the way we treat our neighbor. Loving our neighbor means more than just being kind to our family and friends . . . those who are most closely connected to us. It means to do right *by widows or orphans*:

*Making sure that the hungry are given food to eat. . . .
That we work to find shelter for the homeless or help them in some real way. . . .
That the unemployed not suffer from lack of resources to help them find work. . . .
That the poor have their basic needs met. . . .
That the elderly are well taken care of. . . .
That the young are well educated. . . .
That the lonely are paid attention to. . . .*

We have to expand our definition of **neighbor** and our relationships with and responsibilities toward others. This is the true meaning of these commandments: “*The commandments to love God with all one’s heart and to love one’s neighbor as one-self are the heart and soul of Christian morality . . . these commands point out the path toward true human fulfillment and happiness. They are not arbitrary restrictions on human freedom. Only **active love of God and neighbor** makes the fullness of community happen. Christians look forward in hope to a true **communion** among all persons with each other and with God.* (US Bishops, *Economic Justice for All*)

The only time Jesus speaks of judgment is in Matthew 25: “*When I was hungry, you gave me to eat; when I was thirsty you gave me to drink. When I was naked you clothed me, in prison and you visited me . . .*” Jesus teaches us that we aren’t only to think of ourselves and our immediate family. He reminds us that we are part of **God’s family** and because we are so intimately connected, we have to look after one another’s needs. Jesus insists that the whole law and teaching of the prophets hangs on these two commandments of love.

It’s so easy to follow these two commandments . . . love God and love his people. This isn’t hard decision making. Every decision we make has to be done in the light of whether it will help us love God and his people more. When we live in imitation of Christ, our actions become visible. Faith calls for the response of choosing to act like Jesus in the will of the Father.
