

TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Today we hear Jesus tell a parable of a landowner who takes tender loving care of his vineyard. He tends it, protects it, and watches over it, much as the vineyard owner in Isaiah's parable does. But at harvesttime his tenants assault those he sends to collect the harvest, even his own son. Jesus must realize how closely this parable will resonate with his own life. He asks the chief priests and elders what the landowner will do these tenants. They reply, "He will put those wretched men to a wretched death and lease his vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the proper times" (Matthew 21:41). They are so close. They realize these tenants deserve punishment. They know the vineyard needs a proper harvest. But they're missing an essential part. As Jesus will soon say from the cross, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34). The blood shed in the parable becomes redemptive on the cross. The son rejected by the tenants becomes the cornerstone of our faith. The vineyard—that is, our world and all who are in it—is now entrusted to us. We must give it the tender loving care God desires, so we can produce fruit for God's kingdom.

What will you do that will bear fruit for others and for God?

"Hope of the Harvest. . .the Kingdom of God" is our teaching on Wednesday in RCIA. People throughout the Espanola Valley, Chimayo, Pojoaque and Santa Cruz are coming to the end of the harvest of their crops: chili, corn, cucumbers, tomatoes, zucchini. . .so it would be easy to relate this event to the teaching of Jesus that the kingdom of God is at hand. The signs of the kingdom are the rich harvest, the abundant yield.

We, as Catholic Christians, believe that our Lord is present **in his word** and **in the blessed Eucharist** we receive each time we are present at Mass. We believe that Jesus is present with us **when two or more of us gather in his name.** We also believe that Jesus is present with us **every moment of every day**—he promises us, "Why do you worry? Do you not know that I care for you even as I care for the lilies of the field and the birds of the air?" And, his promise, "I will be with you to the end of time."

We believe God created us to be obedient to his will. We need to pray daily for all those things we are thankful for. We experience signs of the kingdom when we experience and see good relationships, peace within and among families and nations, growth in our lives, a sense of community in our church and in where we live, sharing among people, serving those in need, taking responsibility for our actions. . .

We know that the kingdom of God is not yet fulfilled. We are struggling with warring among nations, with the possibility of taking part in combating a serious threat to stability in Middle Eastern nations, the destructive threat Ebola is posing to our African brothers and sisters, economic problems, destruction of family life and values and so many divisions in our government. Our baptismal faith is not being lived as we promised although to live this faith would bring great dignity to us as children of God, brothers and sisters of Jesus himself.

So, in our lives today, we experience both living in the kingdom now and very aware of its absence. One of the greatest virtues we have as Catholic Christians is the virtue of HOPE!

We place our hope in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. People who have all they need sometimes feel they have no need for hope. We hope regardless of our circumstances or the concern for what's happening in our world. . .because our hope is centered in JESUS!!

Please come to RCIA this Wednesday. We meet from 7-9 and invite not only those who would like to receive the sacraments of the Church, but also those who want to grow in their knowledge and love of Jesus Christ. Any adult who would like to join our Sponsor Ministry is invited to come to RCIA. Please call the number in the bulletin to offer your help. WE NEED YOU!!!




