This time of year, we are doing the most shopping and servicing of our vehicles for long trips. We need exceptional care for pets and our homes while we are on vacation or after company leaves. We have compiled a list of businesses voted by

readers to ensure businesses can give the best Central Texas welcome, said the Belton Journal Sales Executive Kimberly Cables.

In the dermatology category reader's chose RealSkin, located at 1618 Canyon Creek Dr #120 in Temple, as their favorite dermatology clinic.

"We have 10 clinics throughout central Texas. We are a rural dermatology practice offering great care in the region close to patient's home. We provide medical, surgical dermatology, aesthetic dermatology, Mohs micrographic surgery, and radiation therapy for skin cancer," said Russell Rowe, M.D.

They just celebrated their 5th year as an independent practice. They also just opened their own building in Woodway that is 5,000 square feet

with 12 exam rooms.

"We celebrate everyday with our patients. We are very proud and humble to be recognized and appreciated by our fellow residents. We've lived in Bell County since 2012. I spent 22 years in the Army and served from 2012-2015 at Fort Hood," said Dr. Rowe.

He started his own practice in 2019. All three of his daughters graduated from Belton High School. He's supported Belton through different arenas. He's supported the cheerleaders and football team. He offers an annual scholarship to students at Belton High School.

"The \$1,000 scholarship is a part of the Belton Educational Enrichment Foundation named the William Rowe Memorial Scholarship in remembrance of my dad. It's designed for dependents of active-duty military. I was deployed to Iraq twice and Afghanistan four times. We moved 10 times in 22 years, so we know how hard it is for military families. We were able to put down roots in Belton," said Dr. Rowe.

He is board certified in dermatology and his wife Susie is his front desk person and a willing partner. They started the business five years ago, knowing independent practice is not easy. Their desire to put the patients first ahead of the business is why they started. They focus on patient care as opposed to working in a large organization. The clinics outside of Temple are located in Brownwood, Clifton, Comanche, Fairfield, Gatesville, Hamilton, Hillsboro, Marlin, Temple, and Woodway.





Things to know before giving pets as gifts

Imagine this scenario: A family is gathered around exchanging presents. There is one last gift tucked away. You hand the present to a child, and he or she opens it to find a puppy or kitten. The tears of happiness start flowing and the big smiles on all involved will be forever captured in photos and video. The pet immediately becomes a cherished member of the family.

Of course this scenario is perfect when giving a pet as a gift. A recent ASPCA study found that pets received as gifts generally have a low return rate. According to the survey, 96 percent of the people who received pets as gifts thought it either increased or had no impact on their love or attachment to that pet. The survey also revealed no difference in attachment based on the gift being a surprise or being known in advance.

Even with such sunny outcomes, there is still the possibility that a pet given as a surprise gift may not be welcomed with open arms. In fact, many animal organizations frown upon giving pets as gifts. Rather than getting into a situation where an animal's welfare could be at risk, it is important to keep a few things in mind when considering gifting a pet.

• Don't make it a surprise. Unless it's for your own children, do not give a pet as a surprise gift. Even if a person has expressed an interest in having a pet, he or she may not be ready at the moment. Talk the gift idea over with the potential recipient if your mind is set on gifting a pet so that you can make it a collaborative effort. The thought is still there.

• Pay for adoption fees. You can visit a shelter and preemptively pay the adoption fees if you know that a person will be adopting a pet in the near future.

This way you can make the gift a surprise and enable the recipient to choose the right timing to go pick out a pet.

• Offer supplies instead. Another pet-related gift idea is to offer a gift card to a nearby pet retailer so that the person will be able to stock up on supplies when the time comes to get a pet.

• Do not act on impulse. A pet is a very personal decision. Even if someone you know is very interested in getting a pet, he or she may want to pick out the pet rather than have that choice made by a loved one. Taking away the opportunity to select and bond with a given companion animal could backfire.

Although giving pets as gifts often works out for the best, it's always best to test the waters and tread carefully to maximize the chances that the pet fits in at its new home.





How communities benefit when consumers shop local

Ideas about shopping are never set in stone, as we have seen in the past recent years just how quickly consumer trends and opinions can change. Many individuals are now reevaluating how they spend their hard-earned money, particularly since inflation has affected just how far a dollar can be stretched. When consumers think about which stores to patronize, locally owned businesses may be the smartest option for a number of reasons — not the least of which is the way such enterprises benefit the communities they call home.

More money kept in the community

Shopping locally means that more money will stay in the community. According to recent research from Civic Economics, local eateries return nearly 79 percent of revenue to the community, compared to just over 30 percent for chain restaurants. Overall, for every \$100 spent at a local business, around \$73 remains in the community, verus roughly \$43 when shopping at a non-locally owned business.

Get a personal touch

Local business owners typically are inclined to go the extra mile for their customers and are personally invested in the services and products they are selling. As a result, shopping locally tends to be a personalized experience. Furthermore, a local business owner may be more amenable to ordering products for specific clientele. Such person-

alized service is typically not accessible when shopping big box stores or other shops where owners are off-site.

Lines are short

Waiting in long lines for checkout or to pick up merchandise ordered online can drain consumers' energy and contribute to stress. Local businesses tend to have short lines and small crowds, which can lead to a more pleasant shopping experience.

Generates tax revenue

Local businesses generate more tax revenue per sales dollar, according to Rubicon, a digital marketplace for waste and recycling businesses. Taxes paid by local small businesses go to support schools, parks, roads, and other programs that benefit the community as well.

Support nonprofits

Local businesses often support good work in the community, such as nonprofit groups. These can include schools and sports teams, among other groups. According to Dr. Sue Lynn Sasser, professor of economics at the University of Central Oklahoma, studies indicate nonprofits "receive 250 percent more support from small businesses than larger ones."

Support other local businesses

Local business support other local businesses by buy-

ing and selling among each other. A local, independently owned restaurant may source its ingredients from local farms, which means visitors to such eateries are supporting multiple local businesses each time they dine out.

Small businesses are a boon to the economy, particularly local economies. These enterprises help their communities in a multitude of ways.


