# Broncos play with heart against Eagles

Lake Belton's offense fought until the final whistle, but Georgetown's explosive attack proved too much for the Broncos to overcome Friday night as the Eagles left town with a 50–40 district win. Despite the loss, the Broncos showed heart, and flashes of big play potential in a back-and-forth contest that remained competitive deep into the fourth quarter.

From the opening drive, Georgetown set the tone with a fast paced offensive tempo. The Eagles wasted little time moving the ball, covering 64 yards in just three plays to open the game. Strong blocking helped set up a 19-yard touchdown pass to give Georgetown an early 6–0 lead with 10:13 left in the first quarter. After a successful conversion, the Eagles went up 7–0 and soon doubled their advantage.

Following a Lake Belton punt, Georgetown struck again with another efficient drive. This time, wideout Xavier Warren took a short screen pass and turned it into a 44-yard touchdown,

extending the Eagles' lead to 14–0 midway through the first quarter.

Lake Belton began to find rhythm on its next possession, leaning on its dynamic running back Zyien Dupree. Behind strong offensive line play, Dupree and quarterback Jessiah James







orchestrated a 65 yard drive that ended in line. Running back Jett Walker capped the a touchdown. With under a minute left drive with an 8 yard rushing touchdown, in the first quarter, Dupree powered into the end zone from five yards out to cut left in the half. Georgetown's lead to 14-7.



After the game, head coach Brian Cope praised his team's effort and resilience.

"I saw a bunach of kids fight for all 48 minutes, clawing for every inch and every yard on both sides," the coach said. "I'm really proud of them. They left it all out there, especially our seniors, and their character showed tonight."

He also commended the defense for their toughness against Georgetown's topranked offense.

"They're very good, the number one offense in the district, and I thought we made them earn every yard," he said. "The margin of error is slim against a team like that, but our kids fought. That's what I asked them to do for 48 minutes."

The coach also highlighted James' leadership and Dupree's continued development.

"Jessiah did a great job understanding coverages and attacking the right spots," he said. "And Zyien that 70 yard run, the way he finished it's just fun to watch him continue to grow. That's what makes high school football special, seeing kids improve every week"

With one regular-season game left, the Broncos remain in playoff contention.

"If we win Thursday, we're in the playoffs," the coach said. "We just have to learn from this one, have a short-term memory, and get better Monday through Wednesday."

Lake Belton will close its regular season Thursday night at Chaparral, where a win would secure a postseason berth and another chance to showcase the heart and fight that defined their performance against Georgetown.


