

### Lake Belton shuts out Leander, 45-0

The Lake Belton Broncos dominated on homecoming night, shutting out Leander 45-0 in a statement win that showed how far this team has come in district play. From the opening kickoff, Lake Belton controlled the game on both sides of the ball. The defense quickly set the tone when Ji'yson Sherman recovered a fumble deep in Leander territory. A few plays later, Aiden Lassih drilled a field goal to put Lake Belton up 3-0 midway through the first quarter. The momentum kept rolling when

Reese rosenbaum hit Braxton Cope on a screen pass that went for 40 yards, setting up a one yard touchdown run by Davion Peter's to make it 10–0 late in the opening period.

Lake Belton's defense was relentless all night, forcing three turnovers and recording multiple sacks. Leander couldn't find any rhythm, while the Broncos' offense found balance between the run and the pass. In the second quarter, Zyien Dupree took over, powering in for touchdowns of 13 and 10 vards as Lake Belton extended its lead to 31–0 by halftime. Zion Harness added a touchdown catch from Jessiah James on a 25 yard quarters. strike, and Ji'yson Sherman came up with two interceptions to keep the Lions scoreless through two

of the night on a one yard run in the third quarter, pushing the lead to 38–0. Not long after, Jessiah James connected with Christian Onchweri on a screen that he took 55 yards to set up a four yard touchdown run by Arrington Alexander, making it 45–0. From there, Lake Belton's defense held firm, forcing punts and a late fumble recovery to preserve the shutout and give the home crowd plenty to celebrate.

After the game, head coach Brian Cope praised his team's effort and execution on both sides of the ball. "Man, they're doing a great job," Cope said. "We've made some adjustments, and I think it's really kind of sparked us. Our kids are practicing hard, they're playing hard, and they're playing for each other. It was a great opportunity for

everyone to contribute especially on homecoming night."

The Broncos' defensive intensity has been a defining trait in recent weeks. "Last week we had nine takeaways, and this week we came up with three more," Cope said. "That's a credit to how locked in these guys are."

Facing a Leander team that came into the night ahead of them in the district standings, Cope said the win was especially meaningful. "This district is tough every single week," he said. "It doesn't matter who you play, you've got to bring it every single time. I'm just proud of our kids. They're playing really hard, and we've got a lot of football left."


