Lake Belton uses big first half, en route to a 28-21 win over Killeen

Thursday night at Tiger Field signaled a few things for the Lake Belton Broncos: their first home game of the season, Senior Night, and a big-time test as they hosted the Killeen Kangaroos.

Lake Belton scored all 28 points in 13:37 span in the first half and used the ground game to salt away clock while the Broncos' defense worked to eventually stop the Killeen run offense in Lake's 28-21 win.

"We held a very explosive offense to 21 points tonight," Lake Belton head coach Brian Cope said. "We are proud of that. We moved the ball well in the first half, and our offense sputtered in the second half. We will watch the film and get back to work."

In the pregame festivities, Cope and Killeen head coach Josh Sadler brought their sons to midfield for the coin flip. Ryne Cope and Gunnar Sadler were teammates in T-ball this past summer. Gunnar won the toss and Killeen deferred to the second half.







The game started auspiciously for the Broncos, as AJ Arrington's first five touches went for a collective 27 yards. On second down and eight at the Killeen 48, Maverik Maddux's throw over the middle and was intercepted by Jamarcus Wilder at the 32.

The Broncos' response to the turnover was swift. Tavaris Miles was dumped on two incomplete passes attempts and sacked by Gavin Owens to end the initial Killeen drive.

Starting their second drive from the Killeen 45, the Broncos drove 55 yards in three plays. Zyien Dupree's nineyard runs and Maddux's eightyard pass to Davion Peters for an eight-yard set up the 36-yard touchdown pass from Maddux to Peters. Maddux's patience in the pocket allowed Peters to create separation for the score. Long Chuong's extra point kick put Lake up 7-0 with 7:15 left in the first quarter.

"Was very proud game back," Cope said. "He is a leader, and the guys follow him. He is going to continue to get better week after week."

Killeen capitalized on a 48yard run on fourth down and one from the Roos' 48. Three plays later, Amari Paige's oneyard plunge put Killeen on the board. Sergio Diaz's point-after tied the game at 7-7 with 3:31 left in the opening stanza.

Peters' 63-yard kick return set up Arrington's 12-yard touchdown sprint with 2:33 left in the first quarter. Chuong's point try split the uprights to extend Lake's lead to seven.

On the first play of the second quarter, Paige darted down the field for a 64-yard touchdown run. Diaz's extra point tied the game at 14-14 with 11:26 left in the first half.

Turnovers costly in Tigers' loss to East View

Georgetown East View earned the win, but Belton beat itself.

Looking to start their season 3-0 for the second time in three years, the Tigers were positioning themselves to achieve the feat early, scoring 10 unanswered points in the first quarter.

Then, Belton began giving away its momentum.

The Tigers committed six turnovers and nine penalties before the final buzzer, and the multiple miscues were simply too much to overcome, allowing the Patriots to escape Belton with a 24-10 victory.

Junior quarterback Will Shepard completed 23 of 33 passes for a season-high 302 yards, and he led the Tigers with 14 carries, but he also threw a trio of interceptions and lost two fumbles.

His first turnover changed the complexion of the contest as Belton experienced a tale of two halves before halftime.

Outside of a couple penalties, the Tigers were almost flawless on the evening's opening drive, punctuating the 72-yard march with Shepard's one-yard punch

Then, after forcing punt, Belton senior Corbin Ramesar added a 25vard field goal to the scoreboard, but things quickly began to sour.

Ross finished as the game's leading receiver with catches for 138 yards, while senior Asa Thomas (6-68) and sophomore halfback Cason Morton (4-52)


