Onside kick return spurs Broncos' 49-38 win

If Friday night's game at Tiger Field told us anything about District 8-5A-II, the games will not be boring.

The Lake Belton Broncos and Rouse Raiders battled it out in the district opener on Lake Belton's Go For Gold Night, a game recognizing those battling pediatric cancer.

Lake Belton Joshua Lighthall's 51-yard onside kick recovery and sprint to the end zone sparked a 21-point swing and helped lift the Broncos to a 49-38 win over the Raiders.

Maverik Maddux's 32-yard pass to Davion Peters set Maddux's one-yard plunge to get Lake on the board. Long

Chuong's extra point made it 7-0.

After Rouse grabbed a 21-7 lead in the second quarter, Maddux hit Peters on a 23-yard pass to the left side. Chuong's extra point cut the margin to seven with 10:19 left in the first half. Gavin Stewart's interception set up a 29-yard touchdown pass from Maddux to Peters. Chuong's extra point tied the game at 21-21 with 5:35 left in the first half.

A 25-yard field goal by Rouse ended the first half, with the Raiders up, 24-21.

Maddux hit Luke Phillips for a go-ahead touchdown of 32 yards. Chuong's extra point put Lake up 28-24.

After a 58-yard Rouse strike to take the lead, they extended their lead to ten on a three-yard touchdown plunge.

On the ensuing kickoff, Rouse tried an onside kick. Lighthall snagged the ball and raced 50 yards untouched for the score with 9:14 left in the game. Chuong converted the kick to bring the Broncos back to within three points.

"Josh Lighthall is on varsity for what he can do on special teams," Lake Belton head coach Brian Cope said. "It was a huge momentum swing for us."

After a three-and-out stop by the Broncos defense, Gavin Owens slammed the door with a fourth down stop.

The Broncos scored again after the stop. Zyien Dupree's seven-yard run with 4:36 to play gave the Broncos the lead, 42-38.

After the Broncos got another defense stop sacking London Morgan on fourth

down, Arrington Alexander's eight-yard touchdown run with 3:35 play provided the richly needed insurance for the Broncos.


Lake got a late interception

Tigers fall on road to No. 7 Gobblers

The Tigers were on the verge of being blown out, but it did not happen.

After a hard-fought, back-and-forth first half, state-ranked Cuero exploded for 21 unanswered points to assume a commanding 42-24 lead with 4 minutes, 8 seconds remaining in regulation.

Belton refused to succumb to the Belton. scenario, however, rallying to take a onepoint advantage, 43-42, before the Class 4A, Division II No. 7 Gobblers produced a 94-yard touchdown drive on the ensuing possession to emerge with a 50-43 victory.

The outcome concluded a contest that witnessed the teams combine for 65 points

in the second half.

A fumble recovery led to sophomore quarterback Sawyer Harbin finding Asa Thomas, a senior, for a six-yard touchdown, and after recovering an onside kick, the Tigers needed one play to convert as Harbin connected with Gavin Ross for a 52-vard score.

Unfortunately, the Gobblers responded On the heels of a 30-yard touchdown with a 94-yard march into the end zone and added a two-point conversion to punctuate the contest's scoring.

Cuero (5-0) opened the game by starting at its own 1-yard line, and it did not work out well as the Gobblers were forced to punt away the possession less than a minute later.

The Tigers capitalized on the ensuing drive, covering 46 yards in four plays with Zecca breaking free for an 18-yard touchdown to give Belton a 7-0 advantage with 10:00 remaining in the first period.

After exchanging fruitless possessions, the Gobblers crossed the goal line with 10:47 left in the second quarter, tying the contest 7-7 on a five-yard touchdown pass from Marie to Dietze.

The score held until 81 seconds remained in the half, when Harbin, who assumed the starting role under center prior to halftime last week following an injury to junior Will Shepard, punched in a 1-yard touchdown to cap off a 92-yard drive spanning almost five minutes.

The cushion was immediately deflated, though, thanks to Marie's 34-yard touchdown to junior Camelo Perez with 26
