FROM THE WORLD PRESIDENT THEMBEKA PAMA

With the cancellation of the 2020 World Council (due to COVID-19) GFS World has come up with a plan for 2020-2021!

The outgoing GFS World President, Vice President and incoming GFS World President have agreed on the following:

- 1. From 9 July 2020 to 15 July 2021, Ms Thembeka Pama will remain in the position of World President with her main focus being on organising the World Council to be held in South Africa in 2021. The World Team will remain the same except for the addition of Ms Lois Frankforter (USA,) the incoming World President who will, from July 2020, work directly with the World President.
- 2. To retain the three-year cycle, the USA will be the host country for two years and the World Council meeting in USA will be held in 2023 as originally planned. There was one application to be host country after the USA and this will be announced in this newsletter.
- 3. Countries are still requested to provide their three-year reports (covering the period up to 31 December 2019) and their statistics covering the same period to the World President so that these can be compiled into an official composite report of the current term. The composite report will be posted on the GFS World website.
- 4. Most airlines are allowing credits on travel without any penalties being charged for travel





changes. So, hopefully, the travel grants made to many countries will still be available next year. Australia through World funds, who organised the travel for Melanesia, PNG and Philippines has asked for a full refund of the grants and, if approved, this money will be put back into the Travel Fund for 2021. If you were sent a grant in cash, please retain this and use for World Council in 2021. The process of travel fund granting was finalised before lockdown and all countries granted were informed.

- 5. As the World Council dates have been changed from 9-19 July 2020 to 15-25 July 2021 because of COVID-19, the Board of the Pat Franklin Foundation (PFF) has informed the office that their funds have been exhausted and they have no further grant for this term. Therefore, no application must be sent to the PFF.
- 6. As everyone has been advised, the deposits for World Council will remain in place for 2021. Registrations are open until 31 October 2020 for new members who may wish to register and attend. At this stage, it is unknown whether the cost of World Council 2021 will be the same as for this year and the World Team will advise you of this later.
- 7. As per the information sheet, 31 March 2020 was the cut-off date for all cancellations and, as such, cancellations were closed with effect from 1 April 2020. However, the cancellation fee of R500 will not apply since the cancellations were because of the coronavirus pandemic. Bank charges will, nevertheless, still be payable.
- 8. The GFS World Project by GFS Sri Lanka "Education for Employment Prospects" has now closed. If you are holding money for this project please contact Canon Val Gribble (valgribble1@bigpond.com) who will provide you with the banking details for money to be sent directly to Sri Lanka. You should advise the World President and World Treasurer of your payment.
- 9. As the date for the submission of World Project applications closed some time ago, there will be no further applications accepted for consideration in 2021. The two proposals will be presented at the July 2021 World Council and voted for in the

Council. After the presentations, the projects will run for two years - from July 2021 until the date of World Council in USA in 2023.

Further information:

As we follow the alphabet in the preparation of the World Day of Prayer guide, this year the program that was prepared by South Sudan has been sent to all country Presidents and is also posted on the website. In 2021, it will be Sri Lanka's turn, in 2022 - Swaziland and in 2023 - Tanzania.

The expectation is that the World Day of Prayer service collection for 2018 and 2019 will be made available and sent directly to Sri Lanka. It is recommended that the 2020 Day of Prayer service collection be collected and donated to the Emergency Relief Fund.

As the 2023 World Council will be in the USA and there will be more developing country participants travelling and, therefore, more demands on the Travel Fund, my humble request is for all countries to use this extra year (July 2020 to July 2021) to raise funds that will be donated towards the Travel Fund. Countries are advised to either deposit the donations into the GFS World Account or to bring the money with them when they come for World Council in July 2021. A time slot will be made available durina World Council "inggungguthela" where each country will be given an opportunity to present the amount or output of their fundraising initiatives.

In conclusion, it is critical that as we work with developing countries and branches, the primary goal should be the transfer of skills and knowledge so that in future they are better able to plan, implement and manage their own GFS work. In other words, we should "teach them to fish" and assist with "fishing gear or tools," rather than "give them the fish."

Let us keep in touch using this lockdown period to come up with ideas on the betterment of GFS Worldwide.


Here is an encouragement that I would like to share with you:

LIBERIA

Greetings from Liberia!

GFS Liberia had its Diocesan Convention under the World Council theme "Growing GFS Together with Prayer and Action" making use of the scripture, Colossians 3:16. The Convention was held at the St Stephen Episcopal Church on 10th Street, Sinkor, Liberia from 31 January to 2 February 2020.

Activities included:

Registration, Devotion, Roll Call, Drawing up of Calendar of Events for 2020, Prayer, Praise and Worship Time, Small-Group Bible Studies, discussing of the history of GFS, attaching meaning to the GFS Prayer/pledge and Motto. Others included reports from the Acting President, Thelma E Duncan Sawyer, the Financial Secretary, Leana Mitchell Kamgar and the outgoing Treasurer, Grace Tete Mensay. Revision of our By-Laws and Constitution, the conduct of Elections, and most importantly a colourful Thanksgiving Service on Sunday February 2.

We succeeded in grouping our members into three categories, namely: Junior Girls (age 7-12), Intermediate girls (13-17) and Senior Girls (18-25). Above 25 years are considered Sponsors/Advisors. In order to retain our girls and young women, we took into account four sets of uniform styles but used the same colours. We realized that many of our young women were shying away from wearing the same style of uniform with the juniors and thereby causing them to keep away. With this strategy put into place, we are anticipating that we will retain the active ones now and go after the passive and new ones.

We were preparing to make our presence felt at the Convention of the Episcopal Church Women of Liberia and our Churches' Diocesan Convention beginning from, the 9th-11th and 11th-17th February 2020 respectively. 6 of our girls will serve as pages at the Convention.

USA Diocese of Los Angeles

We have been on lockdown since about March 20. Schools and non-essential businesses have been closed. Northern California has been on lockdown longer. We were blessed to have a visit from our Bishop Taylor on March 8, the last Sunday before churches started to close. The GFS members were an important part of the day's events. Now some parishes stream their services. My parish uses Zoom so we can interact. We continue to worship at home.







The branches in the Diocese of Los Angeles have not been meeting since the lockdown; leaders needed to take care of their own issues first. However, we are planning an online diocesan-wide celebration on May 16 to celebrate the 143rd Anniversary of GFS. We will use the Zoom app to have a short worship, do some sharing, and teach the girls some self-care and coping skills.

Our leader Mary Mabuoch is the spirit behind these ideas. She has small children, so she knows how much they enjoy being able to see their friends online during this time. Most children have iPads or computers, either at their home or on loan from their school.

Our Diocese is also planning to launch a weekly online program for children in the diocese this summer since activities are still likely to be limited.

PAPUA NEW GUINEA

Like most countries GFS has not been operating any branch or diocesan activities during the current pandemic. The 3-month State of Emergency meant that in Popondota diocese all people remained in their villages. Some members who lived in the town of

Popondetta were able to go to GFS Haus for sewing and craft days.



The Diocesan President remained at GFS Haus together with another member for support, and GFS Australia was able to assist them to meet the cost of power and water accounts as there was no diocesan income.

In Port Moresby Diocese, the Feeding Program ceased.

During the State of Emergency (SoE) there were very few cases of COVID-19 in PNG but one the SoE was lifted, there was a sharp increase and now Port Moresby is in lockdown again.
