GFS MELANESIA

The GFS ministry in the Diocese of Malaita continues to grow slowly but steadily. We are working to build and strengthen the GFS groups in our regions and parishes. Despite some challenges, the support from parish leaders and Mothers' Union members has helped us tremendously.

In the Central Region, GFS programs are active in Sisifiu, Dala and Tiuni parishes. Some are - Bible study and fellowship sessions, awareness sessions to teach the girls about Christian living, discipline and respect,

In the Northern Region, GFS is active in Gou'ulu and other parishes. Leaders are now focusing on training new coordinators for their region and restarting programs that were inactive. A GFS awareness program led by Mrs. Ellen Taka was held in Gou'ulu during the Northern Region Mothers Union Council meeting, with members from the Central Region also attending to support the rollout of the GFS ministry. The event was successful, and new girls expressed interest in joining the ministry.

In the Keava Region, GFS is now active in Transfiguration Parish, Fiu Parish and Foau Parish and is expected to reach out to other parishes. These parishes have begun small gatherings where girls learn about GFS and join in worship and singing. Some parents are also showing support, which is encouraging for the future of GFS in this region.

Looking ahead of the GFS in the Diocese of Malaita our aim is to:

- Have leadership trainings for young girls in the remote areas in all regions
- Organize more outreach programs to spread Christian values among young girls.
- Introduce income generating activities to support GFS initiatives.

In summary, we thank God for the progress of GFS in the Diocese of Malaita. Although we face challenges like transport, lack of training and few leaders, the work continues. May God bless you in all your work.

GFS/USA Lighting the Way: Highlighting the Diocese of Los Angeles, California and the Firefly Program.

In the Diocese of Los Angeles, the GFS is igniting a powerful spark, one that reaches beyond borders, languages, and traditional expectations. At the heart of this movement is the Firefly Program, a faith-rooted initiative that empowers girls to explore the electrical industry while deepening their sense of purpose, community, and possibility.

Hosted by St. Stephen's Episcopal Church in Hollywood and funded by GFS Los Angeles, which generously awarded a \$20,000 grant to support its launch and growth, the Firefly Program offers a two-year journey of discovery. Each month, girls gather for hands-on instruction, work-related excursions, and meaningful dialogue. The program is bilingual in English and Spanish, ensuring that language is never a barrier to growth. It is a living example of GFS's commitment to inclusion, equity, and the flourishing of every girl.

But Firefly is more than a STEM+P (Science, Technology, Engineering, Ministry, and Purpose) program. It is a sacred space where young women are encouraged to see themselves as builders of the future, electrifying their communities with skill, confidence, and faith. As they learn to wire circuits and navigate trade careers, they also learn to trust their inner light, knowing that God's love flows through every wire, every lesson, and every relationship formed.

In a world that often limits girls' dreams, Firefly dares to ask: What if we lit up every path? What if we crossed every border, geographic, cultural, and spiritual, to ensure that no girl is left behind?

The Diocese of Los Angeles is answering that call. Through Firefly, GFS is not only preparing girls for careers in the trades, but it also prepares them to lead, to serve, and to shine, reminding us that when girls are empowered, communities are transformed.
