## **GFS World President's Message**

Dear GFS members and friends around the world,

We are in the Pentecost season – a season some regard as the birth season of the Church. Pentecost coincides with the Jewish Feast of the Weeks, *Shavuot*, one of the three Biblical pilgrim festivals. Although *Shavout* is characterised by a jubilant celebratory mood, after Christ's arrest and Crucifixion (and despite His Resurrection and ultimate Ascension), the disciples were anything but jubilant. When the Holy Spirit fell upon them, Christ's disciples had barricaded themselves behind closed doors, gripped by fear for their safety and a heaviness arising from the uncertainty about what was to become of them now that their Master was no longer with them.

Still battling the ever-mutating corona virus and continuing to face lockdown restrictions with varying degrees of stringency in different parts of the world, almost all societies around the world can relate to what Christ's disciples must have been going through. Like the disciples, people live in fear for their lives. There is uncertainty about the future. Their freedom of movement and association (with the outside world) as well as their economic activity have all been curtailed by COVID 19. Indeed, COVID19 has disrupted everyone's way of life.

In addition to the rampant deaths, there have been negative economic impacts — depressed economic productivity, an increase in unemployment figures and a rise in the cost of living. This has placed an enormous strain on families. Overlapping global crises and unrest as well as climate change-linked natural disasters in some parts of the world have created a sense of a thick, dark, impenetrable cloud that is hanging over humanity.

It was under similar psychological conditions that the Holy Spirit came down like tongues of fire and touched the disciples. This encounter with the power of the Presence of God brought about immediate transformation in them. They were released of their anxieties and were given the power of utterance; they began to speak in various languages. They ventured out and touched the lives of thousands.

Let us pray that we may also be touched by that Presence during this Pentecost season. May it heal and transform our world from these destructive and incapacitating emotions. May the guns be silenced. May God be gracious to us, bless us and make His face shine upon us so that we can continue to boldly "bear each other's burdens" knowing His power remains with us and in us.

#### **AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS**

Since the Center went operational on the 01<sup>st</sup> March 2022, awareness campaigns have been intensified within the Diocese and the community in order to reach out to many young girls and women.

The management team went to all the Parishes and Chapels in Douala where the Project is located. The students visited different markets and the neighbourhood to distribute hand bills and also share their testimonies as a means of encouraging others to become part of this project.

Going to media house (Radio/Television) has also been another way of creating awareness.

#### CLASSES/ENROLMENT

The Center runs morning session from 8:00Am to 4:00Pm and evening session from 4:00 to 8:00Pm. Evening sessions were introduced to give a wider opportunity due to the cosmopolitan nature of the Project location, where city dealers are having diverse activities during the day and may be only available in the evening.

In the same vein, we have introduced a long vacation session for students to spend a profitable three months holiday. This initiative is due to the high level of unemployment in our country. Therefor it is a vital that girls acquire other skills alongside academics which may at the end be helpful to improve their livelihood.

Each session starts with daily prayers and meditation and it is our aim to use the Center as an evangelism channel and for the increase of GFS membership.

The Center has three trainers, two for morning session and one for evening session respectively. The Center has registered five students so far and we remain hopeful that with intense awareness campaigns more young girls will be reached.

A GFS leader often came to mind as someone who had an overwhelming input into the lives of our members. We saw painted china, cups and saucers and charming treasures.

We were delighted to have with us our World President elect, Mrs. Jeanne Withanage who spoke about the place of mothers in Sri Lanka. Being at the heart of the home, there was no need for a special day. Generations of the one family usually lived together harmoniously. Jeanne recalled her own mother, a woman of elegance and style who was active in the early days of GFS. Jeanne shared her own long treasured teddy bear, Kingsley - given to her as a GFS bear at her birth.

We took our National Training Week for volunteers online, making it safer and easier for everyone to join in. The training session on girls' mental health was the most attended, showing our volunteers' growing wish to understand the girls and their needs.

Mental health understanding for girls is increasingly needed. In fact, both national and international studies show that girls' mental health has been disproportionately affected in the Pandemic.

With this in mind, we are feeling extremely proud of our volunteers' proactive attitude towards supporting the girls in their groups.

To evidence our work, we have published our 2021 Annual Impact Report, in which we touch on the impact of the Pandemic on girls, what we have done to support girls, what they had to say about it, and what we see for our future.





We have also begun offering Gender Equality Workshops for external businesses and organisations, in the hope that we can create a more equal world for girls everywhere. Now that groups are steadily opening and re-opening, we are also starting to look more at 'cluster' areas. At the start of May, two of our groups from different sides of London came together to take a trip to a software company for International Girls on ICT Day. 
International Women's Day was celebrated throughout out our Diocese by giving talks about the achievements women continue to make in society.

In April this year our Bishop enrolled 285 girls into the GFS and 287 boys into the Boys Brigade respectively. To us that is tremendous growth and progress.

We were also privileged to host a three days conference for both GFS and boys brigade. We had 373 boys and girls in attendance. The theme for the conference was "Jesus our anchor...". We had facilitators tackle different topics such as first aid skills, drug & substance abuse, pursuing sexual purity and life skills. Children had an opportunity to learn, interact with one another and even make new friends.

Similar trainings also go on in the local churches on Saturdays afternoons where boys and girls gather together for devotions and other lessons. GFS ministry has also spread its wings all over the country and we believe it will bear much fruit.

# **GFS New Zealand**

The students are chosen by their teachers and an Outward Bound representative.

At the end of the programme we have the opportunity to meet the girls and the programme leaders. The students will return to their schools to share what they have learned and be of service to others.

Our university year began with some of our students contracting Covid-19 and many not enjoying the lectures online. However, our students have started the year well and GFS Council members have met with them to offer advice if needed.

One student set up a small tutoring business to help her class colleagues and is keen to make the most of every opportunity. She hopes to be involved with Wellington Plus at Victoria University this year which will provide leadership development opportunities and project work in the community. She is extremely grateful for the financial support she gets from GFS and will go far with her combination of academic excellence, drive, and wonderful people skills.

The students also communicate by email as at times it is not possible to meet for a face to face meeting, coffee and a chat.

Regardless of what GBFS South Africa has experienced in the past three months, these verses remind us to give thanks and proclaim victory in His Name.



### "SOAP for HOPE" - A NEW GFS AUSTRALIA / PNG PROJECT

After consultations with Australian medical personnel who work in PNG and with PNG GFS leaders, Australia has helped prepare a new 6 months project for PNG GFS called SOAP for HOPE GFS.

Members in Australia are raising money to purchase soap in PNG and to purchase material for masks to be made in PNG. There is a crochet pattern for a soap holder, as well as using old stockings for holding soap. Some masks and soap holders are being made in Australia.

The aim of the program is to encourage hand washing and hygiene and to wear a mask as is required in PNG. Very few people adopt this instruction.

Val Gribble is visiting PNG at the end of June and will introduce the program to the 3 diocesan presidents who are being funded by Australia to meet together in Port Moresby. GFS members will be able to make the holders and where sewing machines are available, make masks.
