



## **PE AND SPORT PREMIUM 2024-25**

The PE and Sport Premium funding was introduced by the Government in April 2013 to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision in schools. The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum again this year to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding has been provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this.

- Engaging all pupils in regular physical activity- the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children should engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, 30 minutes of which should be in school.
- Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement.
- Increasing the confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff teaching PE and Sport.
- Providing a broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all children.
- Increase participation in competitive sport.

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### Impact of spending on previous years

- The school has received the Gold School Games Mark for the fourth year in a row.
- The school has continued to maintain high levels of participation at both inter school and intra school competitions.
- Pupils were prepared well for those competitions through the use of lunchtime clubs and additional coaching.
- The specialist coaching has raised physical education standards across the school.
- Sport Leaders have found confidence in leading and promoting physical activities at school.
- Balance bikes have been purchased to improve pupil's access to further opportunities.
- Children and staff being motivated to participate in physical activities.
- Many children across the school have had opportunities to attend competitions out of school.
