As the first woman to be ordained in the CSI* Diocese of Coimbatore, in 1998, I was involved in children's, youth, and women's ministries in both village and urban settings. Along with parish ministry and pastoral care to children in a Girls' Boarding Home, a mentally-challenged

children's home, and to young women in a Teachers Training Institute. Engaged in women's fellowship, organizing retreats, fellowship meetings, and social gatherings, nurturing lives through Bible studies and focusing on gender and social justice awareness and activities. I was also involved in mission and evangelism, chaplaincy, and providing spiritual and moral support to children and women in Juvenile and Observation homes, and people of other faiths.

After coming to Adelaide in 2005, I completed my higher studies and have been the Anglican Chaplain at Lyell McEwin, Queen Elizabeth, and Royal Adelaide hospitals. I was also involved in parish ministry, and teach at St Barnabas and Uniting colleges. I am currently in the Parish of St Luke's, Whitmore Square. My husband Samson is also a

priest and we have a daughter Hanukkah who just finished school.

I thank God for the opportunity to be a part of Mothers' Union - a worldwide fellowship of Christians united in prayer, worship, and service. I am delighted to join you on this journey, and am looking forward to working with you all.
