## **MU Newsletter November 2025**

Recently I attended the MU Australian Council (AC) Conference, held at the end of October. The Diocesan Presidents from around Australia were joined by our Zone C Trustee Dorothy Seip, Sandra Rollands Anglican Church of Melanesia, and Norma Evans Australia, New Zealand & Polynesia. Each DP was asked to highlight something from their submitted report over the 4 days. I spoke of our project/collaboration with Kerryn Lewis and the Diocesan Program, Prevention of Violence Against Women (PVAW) to translate their training into the Karen Language.

## Promotions & Communications, and MiaMia Editor remain vacant.

It's important to expand on the Publications Position. When it looked unlikely that this role was going to be filled, our President felt that she would have to take it on. Lindy Driver (DP Gippsland) heard of this and put her hand up. She knew she did not have the computer skills to complete the financial recording requirements of this role but could not let Robin take on this task as well as being MU President. Lindy spoke with her MU branch, and from her conversation of the situation, they decided they could form a "team", headed by Lindy, to fulfill the role. Church Treasurer Positions often have 2 or 3 people completing different tasks (I do as treasurer in my Church), to "spread the load" of the role. Something that we may need to consider for other roles/positions that appear difficult to fill, on an AC and Diocesan Level. We need to start thinking outside the square of how things have been done in the past.

At our Melbourne AGM in October, there were many Christmas Cards delivered to Bev Cottell, to pass on to June Robertson for Dame Phylis Frost and Tarrangower Womens Prisons. Bev has informed me she had enough to fulfill June's request of 400 cards, with a surplus to be carried on into Christmas 2026! Thank you to everyone who supported Bev and the Womens Prisons with this outreach.

Christine Jensen has forwarded our Advent Devotions, your branch will have a copy, and as always, sends them with her own profound words:

"As we come to the end of the year, once again we focus on the birth of our Saviour and Lord. What a precious time it is. I have been reading the book of Hebrews in my Bible study at church and here in the first three verses we have a wonderful description of exactly who he is. 'In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe. The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word.'

In the Advent readings for this year, I have focussed on the names and titles of Jesus that are revealed in the Christmas story. As we meditate upon them, we are gazing at the real Jesus and why we worship him with all our hearts."
