Dickinson County Fair Market Poultry Rules:

(Please see the complete list of Poultry Dept. Rules in the Dickinson County Fair premium book)

- a. Each exhibit shall consist of a “pen” of two (2) birds of either sex of any meat breed. (Birds must be the same breed, age, and weight).
- b. Exhibitors may enter a single exhibit (pen) in each of the two Poultry Market Classes. Each exhibitor is limited to two poultry entries.
- c. Pre-entry fee is \$3.00 per Poultry Market Class.
- d. Each bird in an entry will be weighed in during the hours of placement. Each bird in an entry will be banded with a marked leg ban on the day of entry provided by the fair. (Please see D.C.F. premium book for all entry dates and placement times).
- e. Each bird will be health checked and examined for external parasites. Any birds that fail the health test will be sent home.
- f. The Poultry Superintendent, judge and Poultry Auction Superintendents have the right to disqualify a bird or birds that are sick, and that entry will be sent home.
- g. Exhibitors will be required to bring their own feed.
- h. Exhibitors are required to provide feed pans & water containers for their birds and clean their pens daily.**
- i. Each exhibitor will be required to complete a record book for each market entry and compete chicken showmanship, in order to participate in the Small Animal Livestock Sale.

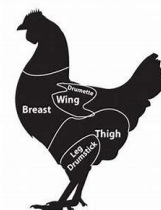

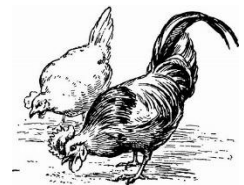

Feed Records

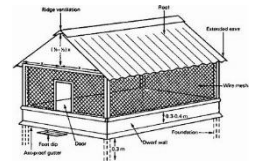

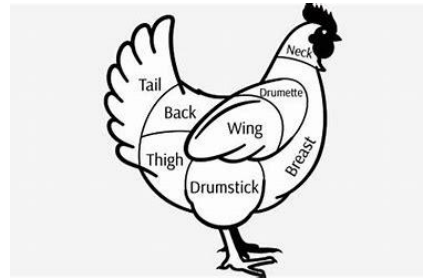

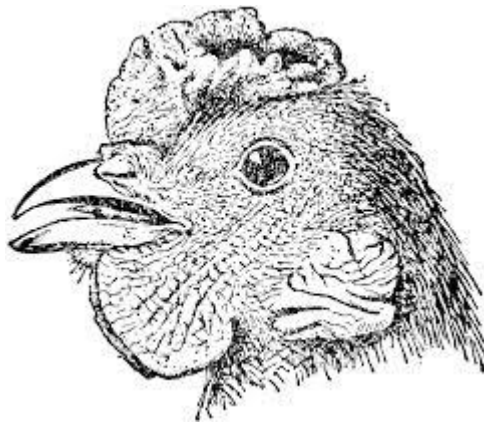
