

Re: Ascension Mission Appeal for Kabale Diocese-Uganda (July 29/30 2023)

Kabale Diocese Profile

Kabale Diocese is one of the 19 dioceses in Uganda located in the southwestern corner of the country—about 280 miles from the capital city of Kampala. We serve a population of about 1.8 million people, and 800, 000 are Roman Catholic. The vast majority of the people we serve are located in rural, underserved, and mostly remote areas of the country. Most critical among the challenges they face is healthcare. Leading causes of death in Uganda include neonatal disorders, HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria, lower respiratory infections, diarrheal diseases, congenial defects, heart disease, stroke, road injury, and malnutrition.

Purpose of the appeal

The purpose of my request is to seek financial support toward the development of a hospital for the rural poor—Our Lady of Good Health Hospital Rushoroza. Through the gracious generosity of many, we have managed to complete the initial phase--outpatient department, minor operating room, medical/ surgical ward and small delivery/maternity unit. We are transitioning into the next phase for which we are seeking assistance, a phase that comprises of children's ward, dental, ophthalmology, radiology, medical laboratory units, and expansion on emergency room, operating room, maternity unit, and ambulance services. Our one and only ambulance is 16 years old and almost beyond repair.

We are also seeking assistance to support our long-term Kabale Diocese Orphaned and Vulnerable Children Program. Through our foster home care program, we provide out-reach support to orphaned children the vast majority of whom have lost both parents and are left all alone to fend for themselves. We provide them with shelter, school tuition, clothing, and healthcare. We are currently supporting 540 children out of well over 20,000 greatly in need of help.

Additionally, although we are eternally grateful for the gift of vocations, currently 78 major seminarians and 820 catechists, we face a mounting challenge of their training and formation costs--\$400/year for one seminarian, and 150 for one catechist in training.

Any measure of outreach help will be greatly appreciated.

RACHEL'S HOUSE DINNER SERVICE:

This service prepares, delivers, and serves dinners for approximately 25 to 40 homeless woman who use Rachel's Day Center and Night Shelter downtown with the support of your Ministries of Charity. We provide a nourishing dinner and a safe place for these women to eat their meals. The meals are prepared, transported to the Rachel's Center, and served by our parishioners. HOUSEWARMING FOR THE HOMELESS:

This weekend MOC is launching their summer initiative called "Housewarming for the Homeless." Please join us in helping FJV in its efforts of helping the homeless off the streets of San Diego. This weekend, July 22/23, we will supply two options for you to help. We will supply either a basket or a small storage bin with directions to purchase (new only) items, either the bed & bath or the kitchen.
