

Job Title: Congregational Care Team - Lay Counselor

Department: Congregational Care/ Pastoral Care

Reports to: Congregational Care Leader

Status: Volunteer

Purpose:

The Congregational Care Team - Lay Counseling serves to offer emotional, spiritual, and practical support to individuals within the congregation who are experiencing life challenges. Lay counselors provide confidential listening, guidance, and encouragement in a biblical context, aiming to promote healing and restoration through faith and scriptural counsel.

Key Responsibilities:

- Offer one-on-one counseling sessions to individuals in need, including those dealing with grief, anxiety, marital issues, parenting challenges, or spiritual struggles.
 - Provide support during crisis situations, offering both immediate care and a pathway for ongoing support.
 - Offer encouragement, prayer, and biblical counsel to help individuals navigate their life challenges and grow in their faith.

 - Collaborate with other congregational care team members to ensure holistic care for individuals and families within the congregation.
 - Lead or facilitate small group discussions related to spiritual growth, healing, and personal development as needed.
 - Participate in ongoing training, supervision, and personal development to enhance counseling skills and theological understanding.

Qualifications:

- A deep personal faith in Jesus Christ and a commitment to spiritual growth and biblical principles.

Purpose:

The Congregational Care Team - Intercessory Prayer exists to serve the church community by committing to prayer for the needs of individuals, families, ministries, and the church as a whole. The team intercedes on behalf of others, seeking God's guidance, healing, and provision. Key Responsibilities:
