Dear All

2025 has been for me another year with a lot of interest and challenges, but also with some sadness. I thought that I might not travel far again, but I decided to fulfil a long held wish, to visit Normandy and reflect on the beaches, the cemeteries and all that the suffering of many had made possible for me. So I went with a group in March for five very moving and challenging days. What those people went through during the early part of my life is terrifying and I am grateful for the freedom they have given us. To see those thousands of graves of late teenage folk - the same age as my grandchildren was very emotional. I only hope that we have been worthy of their sacrifice.

In June I had another journey to north Cornwall to stay with Alison and Mike as in previous years, and they were perfect hosts as usual. We made three fascinating excursions to places of interest. Then in August I went to a sky resort near Geneva where one of the lads from Upton days - Philip - runs the resort. Last time I saw him he was 17 – now 63. We had a good time, with three great walks with sunning views.

And all the time at home I have been leading worship somewhere in the south every Sunday, enjoying walks around Fleet; loving concerts at Basingstoke,

and keeping in touch with the family. Ella and Harris are now 17; they have passed their driving test; enjoy swimming and running respectively; and are exploring universities. Watch this space.

The sadness has been the death of David, my brother, in October, after a 9 month struggle with cancer. It was good to see all the family at the funeral which Jill led - a good celebration of a key member of the family. My cousin Josie's husband also died - born three days after David, and died a month before him.

It will be strange living life without David, but life goes on, and I am grateful to be able to make my contribution. It's a sad and troubled world, but I wish you all a Happy Christmas, and a good New Year living as Jesus would wish, for the sake of peace and justice across the globe.
