# **Activity 7(a) Impressions (20 minutes)**

<b>©</b>	<b>Goal:</b> During this activity, scholars should think about how they are seen by the people in their lives and if this matches how they want to be seen. Scholars will think about how their words and actions
	are perceived by others.
	Materials Needed:

	<b>Distribute:</b> Trackers, pencils, and have scholars put their Name Tents on their desks.

	<ul> <li>"Who remembers something we talked about in our first session?"</li> </ul>

	Introduce Impressions worksheet (Tracker pg. 52)
	<ul> <li>"Some studies say that people make major decisions about us within the first <u>seven seconds</u> of meeting us. How we present ourselves, our attitudes, our posture – people are looking at these things and are forming opinions about us."</li> </ul>

_	<ul> <li>"Do you form opinions of people based on how they present themselves?"</li> </ul>
П	<b>Share:</b> The activity will help scholars think about the impressions that we give to people.
	<b>Ask:</b> Scholars to share an example of a time when they changed how they presented themselves
	or acted to fit into different environments.
	Share: Your own personal examples, such as:
	<ul> <li>When you interview for a job.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>When you make professional phone calls.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>When you're at your job versus when you're at home.</li> </ul>
	<b>Review:</b> The list of characteristics. You don't need to go over every word; focus on the ones that scholars may be unfamiliar with.
	<b>Share:</b> The first 3 columns of your Impression worksheet (either poster or in Session PowerPoint).
	<b>Discussion Prompts:</b> Encourage them to think about the impressions they make.
	"What impressions do we give different groups of people? How we act with our families might be different from how we act at school or with our friends – and what about people we first meet?"

# Activity 7(b) True2U/CMSD Wrap Up Video (35 minutes) Goal: Scholars will explore opportunities available to them and understand how their choices can build strong support networks that help them reach their goals and vision for high school. Materials Needed: Video Link in Session 7 PowerPoint Mentors: Introduce the Wrap Up Video Encourage scholars to take notes for any questions/feedback. Include snacks when time is appropriate. Scholars: ➤ Watch the video to learn more about GPA, high school activities, Say Yes, etc.

# Activity 7(c) Future-Focused True2U Reflection (10 minutes)

- **Goal:** Scholars will reflect on their True2U and 8th-grade experience and brainstorm ideas for their Vision Board. This activity is designed for scholars and mentors to reflect on their time together and what they have learned from their experiences in the True2U Program.
- ♦ Mentors: Introduce the Reflections worksheet (Tracker pg. 53).
  - "We've all learned something about ourselves through this program mentors and scholars.
     Let's take some time to think about what we've learned through participating in this program."
- Options: choose to review questions one at a time or all at once.
- Scholars:
  - ➤ Using the Reflections worksheet in their tracker, reflect on their experiences in True2U by answering the prompting questions.

#### **Reflection Questions:**

- 1. When you're in high school this Fall, what is one thing you'll remember from True2U?
- 2. List 3 things you learned about yourself this year:
- 3. What are 3 things you want to accomplish in high school?
- 4. What questions do you still have about high school, after high school, and careers?
- Mentors and Scholars: Debrief
- ☐ After scholars finish their worksheets, invite two or three volunteers to share one or two of their responses with the group.
- Reflect on this year by highlighting the key points and what lessons can be taken from True2U.
- Discussion Prompts:
  - "Which activity or session did you like the most and why?"
  - "How can the activities/session be improved and why?"
  - "How can True2U be improved for next year?"

# Activity 7(d) High School Visions (50 minutes)

**© Goal:** Scholars create and share their personal vision boards.

#### Materials Needed:

- True2U Vision Board for each scholar
- True2U Vision Board packet of materials
- Markers
- Glue Sticks
- Example vision boards in the Session 7 PowerPoint

# ARoom Set-Up:

- Space for scholars to work on their Vision Board
- Wall or table space to display for a gallery walk
- Mentors: Introduce Vision Board activity
  - "Let's think about our visions for the next four years what we want our high school experiences to look like."
- ▶ Distribute: True2U Vision Board to each scholar
   □ Lay out the markers, glue sticks, and the contents of the True2U Vision Board packet of materials on a table for scholars to use what they want, but they need to share.
   □ Encourage scholars to be creative with their vision boards; however, they want, but it needs to be school-appropriate.
   □ They can write words, draw pictures, glue pictures, list people or programs whatever they feel is important for the next four years.
   □ Let scholars have approximately 30 minutes to work on the activity, and know that they will be sharing their vision boards at the end.
   □ Walk around and assist scholars as needed.
   ♀ Mentor note: If you have materials that you want to bring in to supplement this activity, please feel free to do so, but it is not required.
- Scholars:
  - Work independently to create their Vision Boards.
- Mentors:
- ☐ After scholars have worked for about 30 minutes, gather back together.
- ☐ Lead scholars in the present/share/gallery walk.
- ☐ Remind them that they participated in one back in Session 2 for their Career Cluster Posters.

#### Scholars:

- > Share their Vision Board in a silent gallery walk.
- Walk around the room, quietly viewing each Vision Board.
- > Take notes on something interesting they learned, constructive feedback, and any questions.

	Have scholars share: One or two highlights from their Vision Board or something they learned
	from a peer.
	Discussion Prompts:
	<ul> <li>"What steps can you take to make these visions become realities?"</li> </ul>
	o "What can we do to get back to our goals and visions if we happen to experience an obstacle?"
<b>\</b>	Mentors: Wrap-Up
	"Anytime we move into a new phase in our lives, it's important that we set goals and envision what we want the new phase to look like. Once we have a vision for ourselves, we can then make decisions and act in a way that helps to make that vision come true. No matter where you're going to high school, it's up to you to make the most of it, find your support and opportunities – to do what you can to make your visions come true."
	<b>Remind Scholars:</b> Their True2U Tracker is theirs to keep, take home, and use as a future-focused reflection tool throughout high school and beyond.
	Discussion Prompts: If there is extra time, choose a few questions to ask based on the group
	dynamics.
	Mentors can share their answers to applicable questions as well.
	<ul><li>"What was the best part of this year?"</li></ul>
	<ul> <li>"What words of wisdom would you pass on to a 6th or 7th grader?"</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>"After participating in this program, how would you respond if someone asked, what do you want to be when you grow up?"</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>"What was something that made you laugh this year?"</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>"What was your favorite activity or field trip this year? And why?"</li> </ul>
	<ul><li>"What was your biggest area of growth this year?"</li></ul>
	<ul> <li>"What was one of your favorite memories from this year?"</li> </ul>
	<ul><li>"What are your summer plans?"</li></ul>
	<ul> <li>"How are you feeling about going into high school next year?"</li> </ul>
	"What are you most excited about as you move into high school?"
