Mission and Fundraising

2020 showed great contrast for the programs of Colorado PGA REACH. Golf experienced a boost, while at the same time, the pandemic impacted our ability to run programs that conflicted with social distancing guidelines.

Mission

"Making a positive difference in the lives of others through the game of golf."

Colorado PGA REACH works daily to support our over 820 Colorado PGA Professionals and local organizations to make a difference in our communities. Programming ensures that regardless of your age or background, cost will never inhibit one's involvement and enjoyment of the game of golf.

Funding 92 Cents of Every Dollar

It is with great pride that we are able to report that 92 cents of every dollar raised for the Foundation goes directly back to the programs we support. Additionally, we are very proud that the Colorado Section, along with donations from our Colorado PGA Members, contributes over \$100,000 annually to Colorado PGA REACH.









The coronavirus restrictions of 2020 could not diminish the contributions of our Colorado PGA REACH supporters. Two of the Foundations largest fundraising events brought in more than \$111,000 for our programs in 2020.

PGA Jr. League 142 Teams 1,483 Participants

Although these numbers show a reduction from the 2019 season because of COVID-19, we were proud to be able to offer a limited PGA Jr. League experience, including a post-season event.



Youth on Course

30 Facilities Participated Over 4,000 Rounds Played Over \$30,000 In Subsidies

2020 numbers represent a 125% increase in rounds played over 2019. There were also more participating facilities this year.

Our own Junior Golf Staff raised \$7,782 in support of the program during the 100-Hole Hike.



JGAC 1,755 Members 4,109 Tournament Starts 72 Events 4 Major Championships

Junior Golf Alliance of Colorado had a record year with a 25% increase in Membership over 2019. Unfortuntately, our Golf in Schools program was canceled in 2020 due to COVID.



Jalyn Robinson, 18, who took up golf when she was in sixth grade in Vallejo, Calif., is one of the beneficiaries of donations to youth programs. She now has a full scholarship to Prairie View A&M University in Texas, where she is on the golf team. No one in her family played but she caught the bug and found support through golf nonprofit groups.

"I did First Tee, Girls Golf, Youth on Course, Black Girls Golf," she said. "Golf is more than the ball and the club. It's about the connections and lifelong friendships you make."

The experiences she had in these youth golf programs, she added, "showed me there's more to golf than playing."

Scholarships \$31,500

College scholarships were distributed to children and grandchildren of PGA Professionals in Colorado, as well as to our Women's Leadership Summit Scholarship recipient.



Pillar Grants \$64,600

These funds were distributed to Colorado PGA Members and organizations who developed programs and opportunites that align with the Three Pillars of our Foundation.
