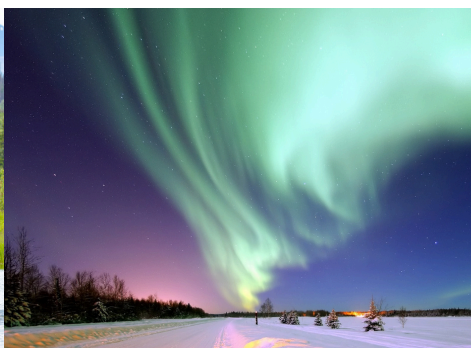

SUGGESTED ITINERARY

Day 1 - Monday August 10 –Flight to Fairbanks

Today depart N. Londonderry by motorcoach and travel to Logan Airport where we will fly to Fairbanks, AK. Transportation will be provided upon arrival into Fairbanks. Your home for the next two evenings will be at the Bear Lodge at Wedgewood Resort.

Day 2 –Tuesday August 11 - Fairbanks Touring (B, L, D)

Following breakfast this morning, you will embark on a day of touring in Fairbanks. The morning starts with a tour down the Chena River onboard the Riverboat Discovery. Following the Riverboat Discovery, take part in an exclusive opportunity by visiting Trail Breaker Kennel for a demonstration on dog sledding and trail lifestyle.

Trail Breaker Kennel is one of the oldest dog sledding kennels in Alaska and was started by the late Susan Butcher, a four-time Iditarod champion with her husband David Monson. Lunch is included with the event.

Tonight, enjoy an included dinner before an entertaining show at the Palace Theater.

Day 3 – Wednesday August 12 - Travel to Denali National Park (B, D)

Enjoy breakfast onboard the Alaska Railroad domed train as you travel from Fairbanks to Denali National Park with exclusive seating. Enjoy a bit of free time this afternoon in Denali where you may opt to add on a flightseeing trip, rafting, ATVing or ziplining (full list including cost will be available in Fall of 2025). This evening is at your leisure with dinner included tonight. The next two nights at the Denali Bluffs.

Day 4 –Thursday August 13 - Denali National Park Tour (B, L, D)

Early this morning, you will embark for the gem of your Alaska trip, visiting Denali National Park. Board a park bus for the Tundra Wilderness Tour traveling 43 miles into the heart of Denali National Park. Enjoy a picnic lunch before returning to the park's entrance. There will be free time on your own in the afternoon, before attending the Cabin Night Dinner Theater.

Day 5 – Friday August 14 - Talkeetna and Anchorage (B, D)

This morning guests enjoy breakfast at the hotel before boarding the motorcoach in the late morning to travel to the quaint town of Talkeetna. Ample lunch opportunities are available in downtown Talkeetna. This evening, board the Alaska Railroad Goldstar cars for a three-hour adventure towards Anchorage with dinner onboard.

The next two nights will be at Springhill Suites Anchorage.

Day 6 – Saturday August 15 - Anchorage (B)

This morning we'll do a city tour of Anchorage before visiting the Alaska Aviation Museum. Here, learn of the bush pilots, the evolution of planes in the wilderness and the need for these pilots and planes to supply those that call Alaska home. The rest of the day is yours to relax or make arrangements to visit more sites.

Day 7 –Sunday August 16 - Prince William Sound, Board Cruise Ship (B, L, D)

After Breakfast head towards Whittier. Stop at the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center and then head to Whittier for your 26 Glacier Cruise which is narrated by a Chugach National Forest Service Ranger. Lunch of chili or chowder served on board. We then board Holland America's Nieuw Amsterdam for our 7 day cruise.

Day 8 – Monday August 17 – Hubbard Glacier Cruising - stay on ship (B, L, D)

Experience the daunting power of the largest tidewater glacier in North America. While most glaciers tend to thin and retreat, Hubbard Glacier continues to thicken and actively advance toward the Gulf of Alaska, earning the nickname “Galloping Glacier”. Sailing into Disenchantment Bay near the glacier’s 400-foot-tall face, you will get panoramic views of its gigantic expanse— Hubbard is a monstrous 76 miles long and 1,200 feet deep. As you sail into picturesque Yakutat Bay, the first all-weather, all-vessel safe harbor north of Icy Point, you will be able to see Hubbard Glacier off in the distance. Passing miles of sandy beaches, keep your eyes peeled for harbor seals lounging on buoys or swimming in waters alongside the ship.

Day 9 - Tuesday August 18 - Cruising Glacier (B, L, D)

Enjoy the breathtaking views, relax and explore the ship today.

Day 10 – Wednesday August 19- Skagway 5:30 am – 9:00 pm (B, L, D)

The tiny town of Skagway still looks like it did during the Klondike Gold Rush over 100 years ago— and today it remains an outpost for thrilling Alaskan adventure. Here, you can enjoy an old-time streetcar ride along bustling Broadway Street reveals well-preserved buildings, including the state’s oldest hotel. You can see engraved walrus tusks at the Corrington Museum or get lost in riveting historical reenactments around town. If outdoor adventure is more your thing, there are plenty of ways to amp up the adrenaline, from sledding with Alaskan Huskies on Laughton Glacier to rafting Lynn Canal, the longest fjord in North America. You may want to travel to the Yukon on the White Pass by train. There are endless adventures awaiting you.

Day 11 – Thursday August 20 - Juneau 7:00 am – 4:30 pm (B, L, D)

You cannot get to Juneau easily without a sprint by air or by sea. But once you arrive, you will find majestic views and rich culture in every corner. With its snowcapped mountains, misty rainforests, massive glaciers and bounty of wildlife, Alaska’s remote state capital is the perfect place to dive into nature. Framed by Mount Juneau and Mount Roberts, the city’s picturesque downtown area offers centuries-old bars, boutique shops and historic landmarks. For a taste of the local culture, visit the historic district and the Alaska State Museum. For outdoor thrills, you can take your pick of activities ranging from whale watching in Auke Bay Harbor to tundra trekking over Mendenhall Glacier, and even try your hand at gold panning in Last Chance Basin.

Day 12 – Friday August 21 - Ketchikan 11:00 am – 7:00 pm (B, L, D)

Ketchikan sits at the southern end of Alaska’s Inside Passage - a gateway to the wild landscapes and seascapes of Misty Fjords National Monument. The canned salmon capital of the world, it is a hub for fishing and outdoor sports. It is also home to three tribes of Northwest Coast Indians, making it a great place to get a taste for the local culture. You will see it in the colorful, hand-carved totems that line the city’s streets and parks, and in the unique stilted homes that cling to Deer Mountain’s slopes. If you want to get up close and personal with nature, venture into the Tongass National Forest, the largest in the United States. Or head to Ketchikan Creek Waterfall for amazing views of downtown Ketchikan and a glimpse at the yearly salmon runs.

Day 13 – Saturday August 22 - Inside Passage stay on ship (B, L, D)

Your ship offers the perfect platform for viewing British Columbia’s Inside Passage. This archipelago spans 25,000 miles from Seattle to Prince Rupert near the Alaskan border. Here you will find calm waters sheltered between the British Columbia mainland and Vancouver Island. Along the way catch a glimpse of breathtakingly rugged scenery, plus staggering wildlife like salmon sharks, white spirit bears, and millions of seabirds.

Day 14 – Friday August 23 - Disembark Vancouver transfer to Seattle (B)

Today you will disembark the ship and transfer to Seattle Airport. Flight to Boston.
(Please note this flight might arrive to Boston after midnight)
