Kellyland - Be sure to soak up as much Ned Kelly lore as you can while you're at the site of the famous Kelly Gang's last stand.

See the six-metre-high Ned Kelly statue 'guarding' the village. Witness Kellyland's animated theatrical portrayal of the last stand, and grab a map from the visitor information centre or take a stroll along the Siege Site Walk to explore several notable sites.

Ballarat Town Tour with Local Historian

Ballarat is Victoria's third largest city, located just over an hour by road or rail west of Melbourne.

Ballarat has enjoyed a rich and prosperous heritage thanks to the Gold Rush which began in 1851. News that the Ballarat region was home to the richest alluvial goldfield in the world resulted in a population explosion as people came from all over the world seeking fortune. By 1855, Ballarat had grown to a city with a population of 100,000 people. Impressive public and private buildings sprung up which were financed from the wealth generated by the diggings.

These days, long after the gold has run out, the city retains much of its rich gold heritage in the form of opulent buildings, fountains, and tourist attractions which celebrate the city's history. Notable buildings include Ballarat's Town Hall (built between 1870 and 1872), Her Majesty's Theatre (1875) and Craig's Hotel which was built in several stages between 1853 and 1891.

11.45am – Arrive **Ballarat Sovereign Hill** - lunch & explore at own leisure **Mark**

Sovereign Hill is a living museum presenting the story of Ballarat as a gold rush boomtown. Gold was discovered here in 1851, triggering the greatest alluvial gold rush the world has ever known.

But this isn't the history lesson you got at school. Sovereign Hill puts you at the heart of the action.

Explore underground on a mine tour, cosplay as a gold rush character inside their 1850s photography studio, pan for gold on the diggings, hop onto a coach ride, see live rare trades demonstrations, try the iconic Raspberry Drops handcrafted only at Sovereign Hill, browse the shops, and meet some colourful costumed characters.

The Spanner Man Sculpture Gardens is a remarkable attraction that reflects the artistic ability of the late John Piccoli. Spanner Man Sculpture Garden is set in 2ha of manicured lawns and gardens with an abundant natural bird life. There are approximately fifty sculptures created from old farm spanners collected across Victoria.

Russian artist Julia Volchkova focused on the town's youth and their love of team sports for her mural in Rupanyup. Julia's work has also transformed little-known areas in George Town and Balik Pulau in Penang.

Melbourne-based artist Adnate is well known for his portraits of indigenous people and their native lands. At his mural in Sheep Hills he has depicted local Elders, Uncle Ron Marks and Aunty Regina Hood, alongside two young children to signify the important exchange of wisdom, knowledge and customs from Elders to the next generation.

Guido van Helten's mural in Brim was the first silo artwork to appear in Victoria and its international success inspired the establishment of the Silo Art Trail. The mural depicts an anonymous, multi-generational quartet of farmers and represents the strength and resilience of the local farming community.

The only female artist on the trail, Kaff-eine spent some time assisting Rone with his mural in Lascelles before completing her own in Rosebery in late 2017. Kaff-eine's artwork depicts the region's past, present and future and portrays a young female sheep farmer and a horseman enjoying a quiet moment.

Brisbane artist Fintan Magee met the muse for his mural at the local pub. Local (lanky) sheep and grain farmer, Nick "Noodle" Hulland, had the exact spirit (and build!) Magee wanted to portray on the narrow GrainCorp Silos.

The Sunset Viewing Platform at Lake Tyrrell, near Sea Lake, Victoria, offers stunning views of sunsets, sunrises, and the vast Salt Lake, featuring the Sky Lounge with tiered seating, a boardwalk, walking paths, and interpretive signs for stargazing and photography, especially when water creates mirror-like reflections or the salt pans turn pink. Visitors can access it via an upper car park, walking a short distance along boardwalks and tracks to experience the unique landscape, which is Victoria's largest Salt Lake.

Located on Cressy Street in the heart of Deniliquin, Waring Gardens is a beloved green space offering something for everyone. Whether you're feeding the ducks by the lagoon, relaxing under the shade of a giant Moreton Bay fig, or watching the kids enjoy the enclosed playground, it's the perfect spot for a peaceful picnic.

Directly opposite one of Deni's best shopping strips, the gardens are both a scenic retreat and a cultural landmark. The site features the cenotaph and Vietnam Veterans memorial, honouring local service members' contributions.

Established in 1888 and named after Deniliquin's first Town Clerk, John Waring, the gardens began as a botanic testing ground for trees and shrubs suited to the local climate. Historic features like the band rotunda and creeper-covered fountain rotunda (erected in 1891) add to the charm.

A footbridge enhances the scenic lagoon system that weaves through the town centre, and on the corner of Edwardes & Cressy Streets, you'll find the Three Muses—marble sculptures representing Art, Science, and Literature, originally crafted in Italy and restored in 1997.
