Charlottetown Waterfront: Bottom of Queen St.

Big Red Numbers: Say Cheese!

Come check out the giant red "2025" at the bottom of Queen Street, where the old Coast Guard Wharf used to be! This big, bold sign gets updated every year and is perfect for fun photos. Lots of people take pictures here - for graduations, birthdays, weddings, family trips, and more! (featured on our cover!)

Right behind the numbers, you'll find the bright red Adirondack chairs, facing the beautiful harbour. Whether you're a local or just visiting, it's a great place to sit, relax, and enjoy the view.



Love Locks: Lock In the Love!

Right near the Big Red Numbers at the bottom of Queen Street, there's a cool metal structure that spells out the word "LOVE". With the sparkling harbour in the background, it's a great place to take pictures.

You can add a Love Lock, a little padlock, to the sculpture to show your love for someone special, like a friend, family, or even a pet. It's a fun way to share your feelings and be part of something sweet. Be sure to add your initials to your lock

Play-Me Piano: Time to Make Some Music!

Right beside the Big Red Numbers and the Love Locks, there's a bright red "Play Me" Piano just waiting for you!

Get ready for fun—rain or shine! There's always something exciting to do right here in Downtown, and our list is full of cool ideas to keep you smiling all year long in Downtown.



Boulder Park:

Grafton St, across the Street from the Mackenzie Theatre.

A special place that helps tell the story of how Canada came together! It has big rocks—called boulders—from every province in Canada. Each boulder has a little sign that says where it came from and what kind of rock it is. The park was made to remember and celebrate how people from all across Canada helped create the Confederation Centre of the Arts. It's like a rocky thank-you from coast to coast!



Downtown Charlottetown Market:

Confederation Landing Park. Sundays from July to the end of September 10am-3pm

Come explore a super cool market with over 70 local vendors! You'll find fresh fruits and veggies, yummy baked treats, tasty foods from around the world, and neat handmade stuff like soap, jewelry, art, pottery, and cozy things like knitted hats and rugs. It's a fun place to look around, try new snacks, and maybe even find a special gift!

Confederation Centre Walking Tours:

Get ready to explore the cool history of Charlottetown! These walking tours take you on a fun adventure through the city, where you'll learn all about Prince Edward Island and how it helped shape Canada.

Your tour guides are called the Heritage Players, a troupe of enthusiastic and knowledgeable guides who dress in period costumes to make history come alive in an entertaining and memorable way. With fun stories, neat old buildings, and lots of interesting facts, the tour lasts about 75 minutes and is both fun and full of surprises!

Harbour Hopper: 6 Prince St.

Get ready for an awesome adventure—on land and water! The Harbour Hopper is Charlottetown's only land-and-sea tour. You'll ride in a super cool vehicle that used to be part of the military, now turned into a fun tour ride! Cruise through the streets and then splash into the harbour to see the city from the water. It's the most fun way to explore Charlottetown!






City of Charlottetown Art Walk:

Charlottetown's streets are full of amazing art for everyone to enjoy! All around the city, you'll find cool paintings, sculptures, and creative surprises made by



local artists. These artworks help tell the story of the city and show off the talent and imagination of the people who live here. Take a walk and see how many pieces of art you can find—it's like a colourful treasure hunt through the city.

Outdoor Shows at the Confederation Centre of the Arts Amphitheatre:

The Outdoor Amphitheatre comes alive in the summer with lively, musical, and family-friendly performances from local artists. Admission to these noon-hour performances is free, with donations welcome.

Paddles: 1 Great George St

Ready for some fun on the water? At Paddles, you can rent a kayak or paddleboard for an hour or a whole day! Glide along the calm Hillsborough River and spot cool historic houses, the pretty shores of Victoria Park, and big beautiful homes along the North River. It's a peaceful and exciting way to explore the Island from the water! Anyone under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult.

Peake's Quay Wharf – Food, Fun & Shops, 1 Great George St.

Peake's Quay Wharf is a super fun place right by the water! You can explore cool shops with crafts, clothes, and souvenirs, hop on a boat tour, or enjoy live music. And guess what? There are lots of yummy places to eat, like Peake's Quay Restaurant, Beavertails (sweet treats!), Dave's Lobster, Cow's Ice Cream, Taters (yum, fries), and even a floating food court! It's the perfect spot for tasty snacks and waterfront fun.

June – October (some exceptions may apply)

Province House National Historic Site: 165 Richmond St.

You can see Province House from the street, but it's closed right now because it's getting fixed up. If you want to learn more about Province House and the important Charlottetown Conference, you can visit the Story of Confederation program. It's full of cool stories about how Canada was created.

Rising Tides EV Bike Rental: 125 Queen St.

Explore Downtown Charlottetown in a fun and easy way—on an electric e-Bike! Rising Tides EV has lots of e-Bikes and cool gear for the whole family. They even have special attachments like kid seats and trailers, so kids can ride along and enjoy the adventure too!





Victoria Row is a super-friendly street just for walking. It's filled with fun shops, tasty restaurants, and live music to enjoy. It's closed to traffic from May to October—perfect for a fun day out!



Downtown Charlottetown has lots of awesome parks and green spaces where you can run, play, and relax with your family and friends!

VICTORIA PARK: Brighton Rd.

Steps outside the BIA, you'll find Victoria Park — a huge 40-acre green space by the waterfront! There's a fun boardwalk by the water, 7 acres of trees to explore, and lots of playgrounds to play on.

Here's what you can do at Victoria Park:

- · Play on an accessible playground with cool musical instruments
- · Climb, swing, and explore many different play structures
- · Splash and swim in the outdoor pool and splash pad
- Play tennis on the lit courts
- · Hit home runs at one of the 3 baseball fields
- Skate at the skateboard park
- Learn about history at the cannon battery and heritage panels
- Visit the cultural pavilion and enjoy walking trails
- · Relax in the green spaces and use the clean washrooms
- Don't forget to grab a yummy treat from the popular Kiwanis Dairy Bar!

Victoria Park is the perfect Place for fun and adventure!



CONFEDERATION LANDING: 2 Great George St.

This park is a special place right on Charlottetown's waterfront where, on September 1, 1864, the eight Fathers of Confederation first arrived! It's a peaceful 6-acre green space located between Founders Food Hall and Peake's Quay.

Here's what you can enjoy at the park:

- · A fun boardwalk to walk along the water
- · A big oval for in-line skating or biking
- · Signs that tell cool stories about the park's history
- A gazebo (a little stage) where bands sometimes play music
- · Beautiful Park art to look at
- A dock by the water to watch boats
- Clean washrooms to use at Peakes Quay or Founders' Food Hall

It's a great spot to play, learn, and relax by the water!





Historic Squares of Charlottetown:

Did you know there are four special parks called squares right in old Charlottetown? They're called Rochford Square, Connaught Square, Hillsborough Square, and Kings Square. A long time ago, in 1771, the Deputy Surveyor named Thomas Wright planned where they would go!

These squares have been important to the community for a long time. In fact, the very first community tree planting happened here way back in 1884. They're places where people come together to enjoy nature and celebrate their town.

CONNAUGHT SQUARE: Rochford & Sydney St.

Just one block from the waterfront boardwalk, this green park has lots of big trees to play under, smooth paths to ride your bike or scooter, picnic tables for snacks, and lots of playground equipment to climb, swing, and have fun on!

HILLSBOROUGH SQUARE: Hillsborough & Sydney St.

This fun place has a playground to climb on, swings to fly high, a basketball pad to shoot some hoops, and lots of smooth paths that cross the park—great for riding bikes or scooters.

KING SQUARE: Kent St. & Weymouth St.

This beautiful park has colorful flowerbeds, smooth walkways to stroll on, and signs that tell interesting stories. The coolest thing here is the five giant bronze chairs—made to honor Mark Butcher, a local furniture maker from long ago. They're super big and fun to see.

ROCHFORD SQUARE: Rochford & Pownal St.

This big 4-hectare park has a beautiful garden that looks like it's from long ago, with fancy flower beds, lots of walking paths, old trees, and comfy benches where you can rest and enjoy the view.







Indoor Fun Awaits!

The Alley – Glow Bowling 200 Richmond St.

Get ready to bowl in the dark with bright, glowing lights! The Alley has 14 cool bowling lanes that are super fun for everyone. Try knocking down 5 pins with 3 balls and go for all the strikes! You can also enjoy yummy food while you play. (Just a heads up: after 10:00 pm, it's for adults 19 and older.)

All About Golf Indoor Mini Putt: Lower Level, Confederation Court Mall

Come play inside at a huge golf spot with a 5-hole putting green, a big 18-hole championship course, and a chipping green! It's the biggest one of its kind in North America! The par-44 championship course is tricky enough for golf pros but fun for kids and beginners, too. Everyone can have a great time trying to get a hole-in-one!

Blank Canvas Art Supplies: Confederation Court Mall

This art supply store has everything you need to create awesome art! They also offer fun workshops for all ages where you can learn new art skills and make cool projects.


