Gospel Reflection

In the Gospel from Matthew 18:15-20, Jesus teaches the importance of addressing wrongdoing directly and privately, seeking reconciliation with mercy and clarity. The goal is restoration, not punishment. We engage others with tenderness, relying on God's love poured into us by the Holy Spirit. He assures us that where two or three gather in His name, His presence accompanies efforts toward reconciliation.

Identify strained relationships in your life where distance or avoidance has replaced communication. Consider whom you have allowed to drift without addressing hurts or misunderstandings.

Speak with courage and mercy, aiming to restore rather than judge. Begin with one-on-one conversation, respecting the dignity of the other and guided by love rather than ego.

Rely on God's grace. True reconciliation is not achieved through human effort alone; prayer and the inspiration of the Holy Spirit equip us to love courageously and forgive fully.

Accept outcomes, knowing that not all relationships can be fully restored. Our responsibility is faithfulness, not control over the other person's heart.

Prayer

Lord Jesus, help me to reach out with courage and mercy to those I have avoided. Pour Your love into my heart so that my words carry Your grace and truth. Teach me to balance honesty with compassion, and when reconciliation is not possible, give me the wisdom to entrust others to You. Amen.

This Sunday's reflection invites us to take the first step toward reconciliation, guided by God's love, acknowledging both the difficulty and the profound grace of mending relationships.

Offering Prayer

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace,

Where there is hatred, let me bring love;

Where there is injury, pardon;

Where there is doubt, faith;

Where there is despair, hope;

Where there is darkness, light;

Where there is sadness, joy.

O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console;

To be understood as to understand;

To be loved as to love.

For it is in giving that we receive;

It is in pardoning that we are pardoned;

And it is in dying that we are born to eternal life. Amen
