Dear Seminole County Voters,

As we head into an election year, now is the perfect time to get **Election Ready**. Taking a few minutes today can help ensure a smooth voting experience later. Whether you plan to vote by mail, early, or on Election Day, preparation is key.

Start by checking your voter registration to confirm your name, address, and party affiliation are current. Have you moved recently, changed your name, or updated your driver's license? Those changes don't automatically update your voter record — so it's important to review and make any needed updates.

Finally, if you like the convenience of Vote-By-Mail, be sure to renew your request for upcoming elections. Vote-by-mail requests must be renewed after each general election, and renewing early helps guarantee your ballot is sent on time. A few simple steps now can make all the difference later — we're here to help every step of the way

## MARK YOUR CALENDAR: 2026 ELECTION DATES

The 2026 elections are fast approaching. Stay informed and plan ahead by adding these important election dates and deadlines to your calendar now.

### 2026 FLORIDA PRIMARY ELECTION

- **ELECTION DAY: TUESDAY, AUGUST 18, 2026**
- VOTER REGISTRATION AND PARTY AFFILIATION DEADLINE: JULY 20, 2026
- VOTE-BY-MAIL REQUEST DEADLINE: AUGUST 6, 2026

### 2026 GENERAL ELECTION

- **ELECTION DAY: TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2026**
- VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE: OCTOBER 5, 2026
- VOTE-BY-MAIL REQUEST DEADLINE: OCTOBER 22, 2026

## REQUESTING A MAIL BALLOT

The deadline to request that a ballot be mailed to you  
is 5:00 p.m. on the 12th day before Election Day.

## Helpful Tips

- Carefully mark your ballot from home at the time most convenient for you,  
Then mail it in or drop it off at one of our secure locations.
- If returning your ballot by mail, we recommend that you allow at least 5-7 business days  
for your ballot to be received by our office.
- Vote-by-Mail ballots must be received by our Main Office by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

If you've recently renewed or replaced your Florida Driver license or ID card, your ID number may have changed due to new state requirements.



Be sure to update your Voter Registration with your new ID number.

## HIGH SCHOOL VOTER REGISTRATION: LOOK FOR US ON CAMPUS!

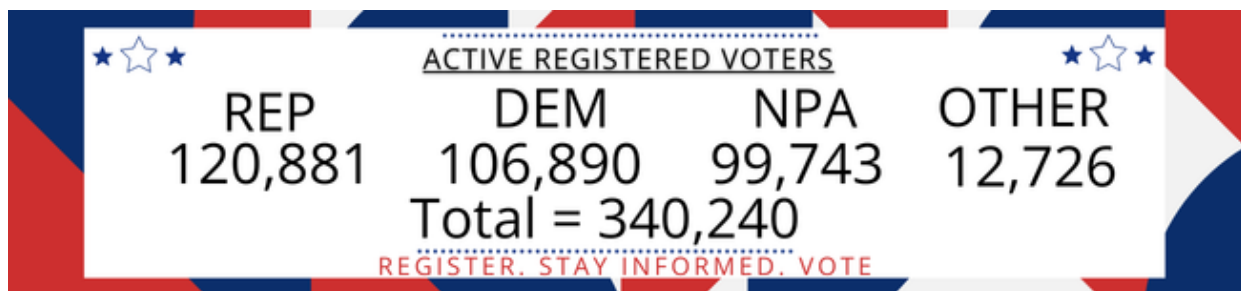
