**Supervisor of Elections Amy Pennock Launches 2026 “I Voted” Sticker Design Contest for Seminole County Students**

Elementary and Middle School Students Invited to Create Official “I Voted” Sticker for 2026 Election Cycle

**Seminole County, FL (January 26, 2026)** – Seminole County Supervisor of Elections **Amy Pennock** is inviting **all elementary and middle school students** in Seminole County to participate in the 2026 **“I Voted” Sticker Design Contest**, offering students a creative opportunity to learn about civic engagement while contributing to the upcoming election cycle.

Students are encouraged to design an original, nonpartisan “I Voted” sticker that may be used during the 2026 Election Cycle. Three winning designs will be selected.

The winning designs will be:

- Printed as official **2-inch round “I Voted” stickers** and distributed to voters
- Featured on the Supervisor of Elections **social media platforms**
- **Displayed** in the Supervisor of Elections Office
- Used in **additional voter outreach and education efforts**

This contest provides a fun and interactive way to introduce young students to the democratic process. By designing an “I Voted” sticker, students help encourage civic pride and participation throughout the Seminole County community.

**Contest Guidelines**

All submitted artwork must meet the following requirements:

- Be **two-dimensional**
- Be **round and 6 inches in diameter** (using the provided template)
- Be **scalable to 2 inches** for printing
- Be **original artwork only** (no copyrighted images)
- Be **nonpartisan and nonpolitical**

- Clearly include the phrase “**I Voted**”

Winning artists must provide the original artwork to the Seminole County Supervisor of Elections Office.

#### **Submission Details**

- **Contest Deadline: February 23, 2026**
- Each entry must include a **completed contest entry form**
- Artwork should remain clear, readable, and visually engaging when reduced to a **2-inch round sticker size**
