ACCESSIBILITY UPDATE



It may seem there's been a pause in activity in the Becoming One Body Accessibility Project, but actually there has been significant progress made in the last several months.

First, an update on the Capital Campaign: We already have \$3.8 million pledged to the Becoming One Body Capital Campaign. Thank you to our campaign chairs, Josh and Susy Hendrickson and David and Lisa Hardy, and most of all, thank you to everyone who has participated so generously to this campaign, both with money and time. Having 85 percent of the \$4.5 million campaign goal at this point is amazing (and it is certainly not too late to contribute)! All the funds contributed over the last several years toward the project are being held in a designated, interest-bearing account until needed.

Matheny Goldmon Architects and Interiors have been working to complete the detailed construction documents, which they intend to deliver next week.

Fite Building Company, our contractor for the project, was the unanimous choice of the Accessibility Committee, the Building and Grounds Committee, and the Vestry. Fite will be working throughout the month of May refining their final pricing proposal and working with subcontractors and material suppliers. Early in June we hope to have a formal contract with Fite, which will allow us to break ground before the end of June!

Construction is projected to take 18 months. In the end, we will have all of our space accessible for all people while maintaining the beauty of our historic church. If you have any questions or comments please contact me.

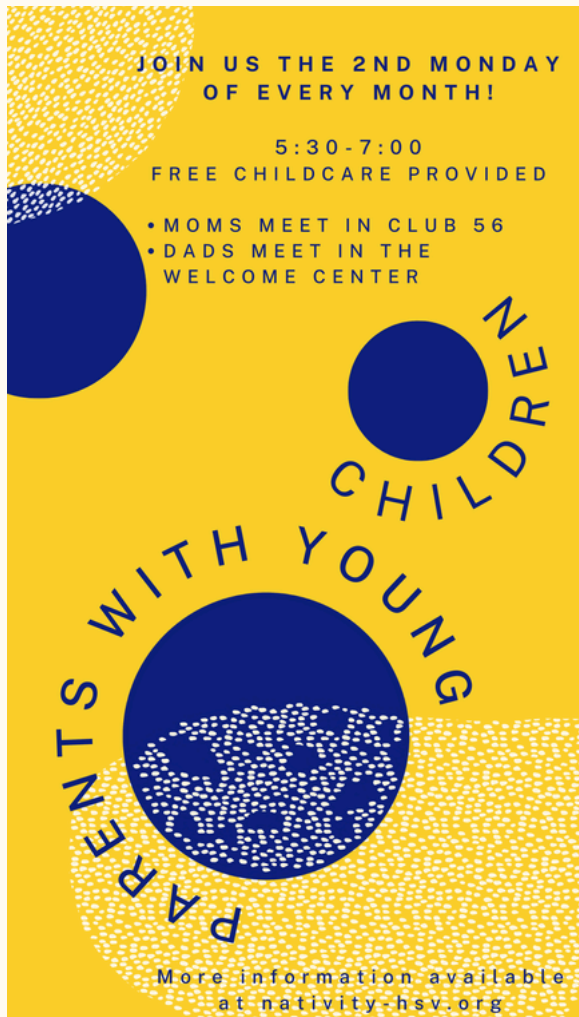

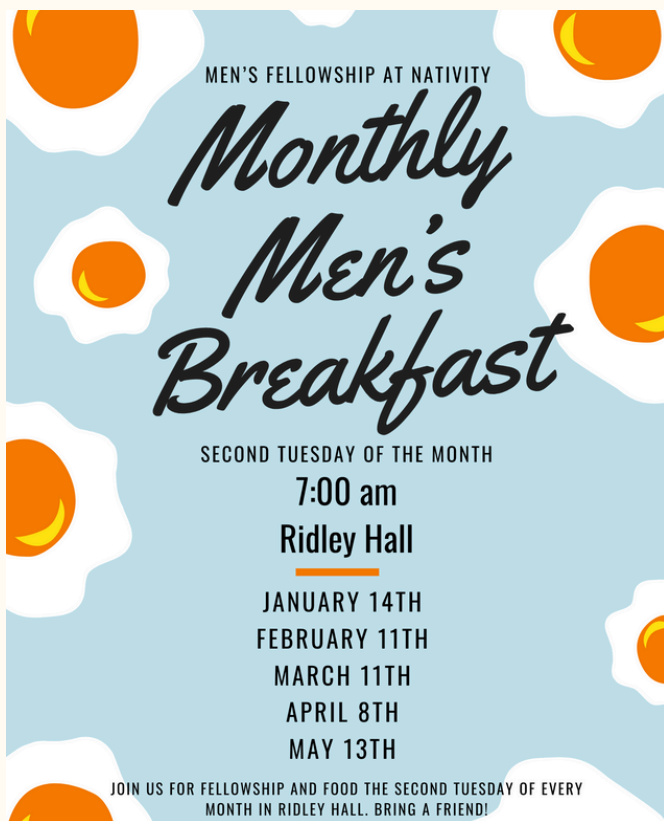

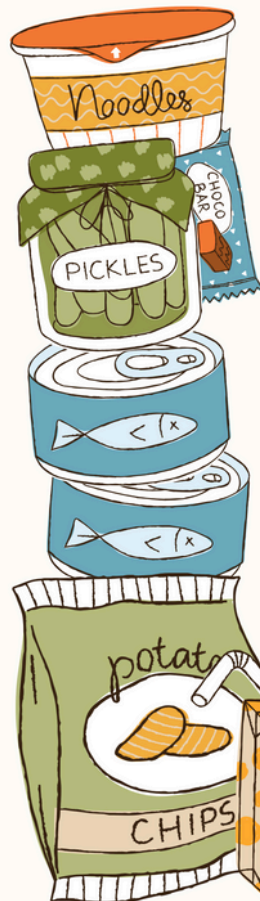

OUTREACH

The Outreach Committee is very happy to announce the recipient of the 2025 Greene Street Market Grant, ShowerUp Huntsville. \$25,000 will be used to purchase a Laundry Trailer. The laundry trailer will have 3 washers and 3 dryers. This will be the first laundry trailer in Huntsville.

For individuals experiencing homelessness and poverty, the struggle goes beyond securing shelter or food-it extends to basic hygiene and cleanliness. While ShowerUp has been restoring dignity through mobile shower services, there remains a critical gap: access to clean clothing.

We are excited about this additional ministry for our city. ShowerUp currently provides showers for over 500 individuals a month, nearly all of whom would benefit from access to clean clothing.

As the weather warms and nature awakens around us, we have a wonderful opportunity to reconnect with both our community and the earth — by buying fresh, local food at Greene Street Market.

While the Bible doesn't directly command us to "buy local," it speaks

profoundly about the relationship between land, food, and people. Scripture emphasizes stewardship of the earth and the importance of fellowship — both of which are beautifully nurtured when we support local farmers and artisans. The Greene Street Market offers a place to strengthen relationships, build community, and care for creation in meaningful ways.



Why Buy Local? Environmental Stewardship

Choosing local food is an act of stewardship. It helps reduce environmental impacts in several important ways:

- **Lower Carbon Footprint:** Local food doesn't have to travel thousands of miles to reach your plate, cutting down on transportation emissions significantly.
- **Water Conservation:** Research from Iowa State University shows that local growers typically use 10% less water compared to large commercial farms — a meaningful difference in conserving this precious resource.
- **Reduced Packaging Waste:** Without the need for heavy shipping and grocery store handling, local produce usually comes with minimal packaging, helping to cut down on plastic and waste.

Beyond the environmental impact, buying local food strengthens the social fabric of our community. At Greene Street Market, you have the chance to meet the farmers who grow your food, hear their stories, and support their hard work directly. As these relationships grow, so does your confidence in the food you eat — knowing not only where it comes from, but also the care with which it has been grown.

Local food isn't just better for the planet and the community — it's better for your taste buds too! Because it's harvested at peak ripeness and sold soon after, local produce bursts with flavor. Plus, eating seasonally means you're enjoying fruits and vegetables when they are naturally at their best.
