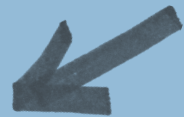
## How To Register

# Registration Policies

## Registration Policies

### Commitment to Quality

If you're not satisfied with a program, service or instructor, let us know. You may retake the class transfer to another class, or receive a pro-rated credit on your account. Commitment to Quality concerns must be reported within the duration of the program/service to be eligible for a retake, transfer, or credit.

### Refunds

All refunds are issued as a credit on the household account for use toward future registration. In the rare circumstance a "cash" refund is issued, it will be processed as a check and mailed to the address on file regardless of payment method. Refund checks take 2-4 weeks to process and mail. Household credits will be automatically issued when a program is cancelled by the Parks & Recreation Department unless a request is made for a check to be processed.

### Withdrawals & Transfers

Anyone wishing to withdraw from a program will receive a credit on their account if the request to withdraw is received at least 7 days prior to the start of the program. Transfers will be granted when possible and only if transferring does not cause a program to cancel.

### Financial Assistance

Residents of the Village of Antioch who apply for and meet established requirements may be eligible for financial assistance to cover program fees. Contact the Parks & Recreation Department for additional information.

### Requests & Accommodations

Participants are encouraged to inform us of any special requests to make your experience more enjoyable or any reasonable accommodations needed to participate successfully. While we cannot accommodate all requests, our team will do our best to meet your needs.

### Medical Conditions & Medication

If you or your minor child have any medical conditions that may affect your participation in the program or event, you are encouraged to inform us at registration; this includes all allergies. Additionally, if your minor child requires medication during program hours, additional forms must be completed.

### Code of Conduct

Participants, parents/guardians, and spectators at Parks & Recreation Department programs and events are expected to exhibit appropriate behavior at all times. This includes being respectful to all people, equipment and facilities and cooperative, positive participation. Contact our office for the full Code of Conduct.

### Disciplinary Procedures

Parks & Recreation Department staff are trained in basic behavior management and appropriate discipline procedures. Disciplinary action is typically progressive and begins with positive reinforcement and redirection.

### Are You Covered?

The Parks & Recreation Department does not carry medical or accident insurance for participants or volunteers. Participating in programs and events requires a signed waiver by the participant or their legal guardian. Certain high-risk activities may require additional waivers.

### Photography & Video

The Village of Antioch takes pictures and video of participants in classes, at events, and in our parks. By signing the general waiver required for participation, you are granting permission to use these photos and videos in Village publications including website and social media outlets. All photos and videos are the property of the Village of Antioch.
