Dear Esteemed Donors and Community Members,

As we look back on 2023, I am filled with immense pride for the strides we have made in our mission to support homeless youth. Our organization has expanded its reach and deepened its impact, thanks to the tireless efforts of our staff, volunteers, and the unwavering support of our community partners.

Our Key Accomplishments of Fiscal Year End 2023 have been the strengthening of our partnerships. We forged stronger collaborations with local businesses, schools, and government agencies. These enhanced partnerships have resulted in increased resource sharing and collaboration, allowing us to serve over 500 more youth in our Drop-in Center. This expansion has ensured that more young people have access to basic needs and essential life skills to help end homelessness.

The other accomplishment was Enhancing Housing Programs. As you know Vita Nova cannot reduce youth homelessness without increasing housing opportunities. This year we introduced a new model called Housing+. The plus (+) is our unique way to not only expand housing options but also integrates additional supportive services such as basic needs assistance, mental health counseling, and mentorship. These elements are crucial in providing holistic support to help youth overcome trauma and build social capital.

Despite these significant achievements, we faced challenges that underscore the ongoing need for our services. Although our model of investing \$18,000 per youth per year yields a young adult who is working, completing school and contributing to the community. The challenge has been finding landlords and housing to place youth in Palm Beach County. Our efforts are hampered by a tight housing market and increased demand, which has made the placements we do have even more precious. The second challenge has been the increasing numbers of homeless youth coming to our doors in 2023. Vita Nova has seen an increase of nearly 20% and this increase makes the placements for housing we do have even more precious. This surge highlights the growing need for our services and the importance of continuing our efforts to provide stable housing and support.

As we move into 2024, our priorities will remain focused on helping youth secure housing, employment, and complete their education. We are committed to building on our successes and addressing the challenges we face with determination and collaboration.

I am confident that with your continued support, we can create a brighter future for homeless youth and ensure they have the opportunities and resources needed to achieve their full potential. Together, we can make a profound difference in the lives of those who need it most.



Meet SOPHIA

One of my favorite songs is "The Climb." When I was growing up in Foster Care, and then later homeless, I used to think this verse defined me.

"I can almost see it That dream I'm dreaming But there's a voice inside my head saying You'll never reach it."

You see when I was a child, I was removed from my family and put into foster care. The system that was supposed to keep me safe only continued the physical, mental, and verbal abuse. I guess you could say the "dream I was dreaming" back when I was a child was safety.

Then I became a teen and left foster care only to fall immediately into homelessness. The supports I was told would be there all fell

down, and I was on the streets. I guess you could say the "dream I was dreaming" when I was a teen was to have a loving household.

As days went on, and I grew older I realized I was alone. I guess you could say the "dream I was dreaming" when I was an older teen was having a family.

Then I met Vita Nova and my life quickly turned around. They listened to me, supported me when I did not have the means to do so, and most of all, they loved me. In an instant I found myself housed, back in school, working (at The Breakers West), and safe. Most of all Vita Nova gave me the confidence to use my voice to help others, and the ability to give back in ways that are improving foster care for younger youth still in the system. Now, thanks to Vita Nova I hear the song, "The Climb" and feel this verse defines me and my life better,

Keep on moving, keep climbing, Keep the faith, It's all about the climb.

HOUSING EFFORTS

Meet BEATRICE (5/22)

Every youth who comes to Vita Nova have experienced a trauma in their lives. These take the form of emotional, physical, or psychological traumas that can easily become a setback for youth on the road to adulthood. Despite these negative experiences, We are astounded by the amount of resilience these youth possess to

rebound and make something of their lives.

A prime example is Beatrice. Beatrice will tell you that one of her ways to cope from past abuse is by reading. At a young age Beatrice found herself as the main character in a lurid nonfiction novel about a young girl stuck in a cycle of abuse. Reading became a gateway to escape and find success in school. She regained a sense of control while reading while her homelife was spinning out of control. Thankfully, someone at school identified some of the indicators of abuse, and Beatrice was taken into State care at the age of 12 and remained until she turned 18. That was when she found Vita Nova.

It did not take long for Beatrice to thrive once she had a safe place to live. She graduated high school while at Vita Nova and attended and graduated from Palm Beach State College with an amazing grade point average of 4.0. After graduating she began to pursue her Bachelor's Degree in Neuroscience at Florida Atlantic University. One day soon Beatrice will achieve her dream of becoming a doctor so she can give back and help others.

The first type of housing, <u>Vita Nova Village</u> exists to provide two-year assistance to youth from foster care, or homeless who need help with learning life skills in four critical areas. These include: Health & Wellness, Financial Literacy, Education, and Employment. Vita Nova served 36 youth at Vita Nova Village.

The second type of housing support assists youth to move directly from the street and into temporary housing where they can live for up to 90 days and then move to housing that provides help and assistance for two years. During their residence youth are helped with finding employment to eventually assume the full payment of the lease in a two-year period. Vita Nova has capacity for 22 youth under this **Rapid-Re-Housing Model.**

The third type of housing assistance Vita Nova provides help to divert youth from entering the homeless system all together. This can be with a temporary payment to prevent homelessness or our counselor who encounters a youth with a support system in place can tap into existing resources to help a youth avoid living outdoors and avoid ever entering the county's homeless system. Vita Nova served clients with **Diversion and temporary payment services.**

Program Highlight:Dress for success (10/2021)

It doesn't take a big commitment to make a big impact in the lives of our youth.

Here at Vita Nova we provide all of our youth with professional attire to secure employment, but we are about much more than simply a new outfit.

Besides physically equipping our youth with apparel and accessories for a successful interview, our programs give them the confidence and skills to realize their full potential, and achieve financial independence through securing a job.





the Spot - Youth Drop-IN CENTER

Vita Nova
operates the only
drop-in center for
homeless youth
and youth at-risk
of homelessness
in the county,
called the Spot.
Located in West
Palm Beach, the
Spot is a safe and
non-judgmental
center for youth
ages 18-25 years
old.

At the Spot, a youth ages 18-25 years old can easily enter a cadre of services related to housing, healthcare, mental health, employment and education by just entering the front door.

Once a youth enters the Spot then they are met by an Intake Specialist who can conduct an assessment on immediate needs and goals for year youth. Each youth will then meet the following Spot members for follow up and services:

- Mental Health Therapist
- Employment Coordinator
- Health Care Specialist
- Education Services

In addition to supportive team members the Spot features also features a shower, laundry facilities, computer lab, music therapy room, food pantry, hygiene essentials, and clothing.

Youth Story: M. Johnson

Diversion services aim at assisting youth with diverting from the homelessness system. Through coordinated entry the Diversion program can ensure that there is an 80% reduction in youth seeking shelter services and entry into homelessness. All qualifying youth receive employment readiness training, educational assistance, assistance with navigating health services and therapeutic services if needed. M. Johnson participated in services provided through Diversion such as financial literacy and maintaining life skills workshops. Through his engagement with services, he was able to relocate to Orlando, FL pursuing his education at University of Central Florida and maintaining his own apartment. He also maintained his own vehicle that was in good condition and reliable. He also established employment while working in Diversion full-time with TD Chase Bank in West Palm Beach, FL. He was able to transfer his role to a branch in Orlando, FL, although he had not been there more than 6 months. Through the skills learned, he completed his time in Diversion successfully.

Independent Living Services

Vita Nova focuses on youth ages 18 to 25 to achieve a realistic goal of ending homelessness. We champion the formula of

Housing + Employment + Education + Supportive Living

= Self Sufficiency as a solution to deliver our youth into independent adulthood one by one.

Many services for older foster youth end at the age of 18 years old. At Vita Nova we know this is the most crucial time on a young adult's life, so services are created to help youth ages 18-22 with continuing education, learning life skills and/or finding employment.

Vita Nova served <u>118</u> youth through Vita Nova Independent Living Services this year.


