MAY I WEVER BOAST OF ANSTHING

Dear friends,

Last Thursday, July 3 we celebrated the feast of St. Thomas the Apostle of India. For me, St. Thomas is the patron Saint of the Missionary Society of St. Thomas the Apostle, my own missionary order (MST) as well as the father in faith of Saint Thomas Christians. The passage for this Sunday speaks of the sending of 72 disciples, their joy of being the emissaries of the gospel and Jesus' words on the real reason to be joyful disciples. This suddenly made me think over the joy of St Thomas being the disciple of Jesus in the jubilant cry "My Lord and My God" (Jn 20:29), courageous invitation "let us also go to die with Him" (Jn 11:16); then the famous question "Master we do not know where you are going: how can we know the way?" and the revelation of Jesus "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me (Jn 14:5-6). Now let us reflect on how we can be joyful disciples like St. Thomas the Apostle basing on the gospel passage and Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation, Evangelii Gaudium. In Luke 10:1-12, Jesus sends out seventy-two disciples ahead of Him, two by two, into every town and place He intended to visit. This moment is more than a logistical preparation; it is a profound missionary act rooted in joy, trust, and urgency. These themes resonate powerfully with Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation, Evangelii Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel), which calls all Christians to become joyful evangelizers.

1. **Joy as the Foundation of Mission**: Jesus does not send the 72 with sorrow or fear but with joy. He tells them that "the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few" (Luke 10:2), implying that their work is not burdensome but full of promise and fruit. Mission begins not with guilt or pressure, but with the overflow of joy in knowing Christ. Pope Francis writes: "The joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus" (Evangelii Gaudium, 1). Just as the 72 experienced the power of Jesus and went out with gladness, so too must modern disciples; priests, religious, laypeople be joyful witnesses of the Risen Christ in a world thirsting for meaning and peace.

2. **Mission Is for Everyone**: The fact that Jesus sends not just the Twelve Apostles, but 72 disciples show the universal call to evangelization. These were ordinary followers, not just leaders. The Church teaches that every baptized Christian is called to be a missionary: "Every Christian is challenged, here and now, to be actively engaged in evangelization" (EG, 120). In families, schools, workplaces, and parishes, Catholics are called to embody the Gospel with their lives and words. The joy of the Gospel is meant to radiate outward, not remain hidden.

3. **Trust in God's Providence**: Jesus tells them: "Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals." This instruction forces the disciples to trust entirely in God and in the hospitality of others. Their dependence is not a weakness but a witness: the Kingdom of God is built not on wealth or power, but on grace, simplicity, and communion. The missionary Church today must also live in trust and simplicity, especially when resources are limited or challenges are great. Joyful trust in God becomes its own form of witness.

School Website www.stpiusxschoolcc.org 4. **Peace and Healing as the Fruits of Joyful Mission**: Jesus instructs: "Whatever house you enter, say first, 'Peace to this household.'" The missionary's task is not to argue or condemn, but to bring peace, healing, and the nearness of the Kingdom. The 72 return rejoicing, saying, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us!" Their joy came not only from success but from realizing that God was working through them.

5. **The Church Today is a Field Hospital and a Missionary People**: Pope Francis often describes the Church as a field hospital, going out to those who are wounded and abandoned. The sending of the 72 is a model for the Church today, a Church that "goes forth," not content with waiting within the walls of the sanctuary. "An evangelizing community knows that the Lord has taken the initiative... it knows that he has loved us first (cf. 1 Jn 4:19), and therefore it goes forth boldly" (EG, 24).

Final Thought: The sending of the 72 reminds us that the mission of the Church is not burdensome; it is a joyful calling to share the love and hope of Christ. When Christians live the Gospel joyfully like those first 72 we become living signs of the Kingdom of God, transforming the world one household, one encounter, one heart at a time. "Do not grieve, for the joy of the Lord is your strength." (Nehemiah 8:10). God Bless.
