
# Saint Pius X Catholic Church and School

Dear Friends,

If you are like most people, you probably find it difficult to maintain a regular discipline of prayer in your life. With all the daily tasks requiring attention, it is so easy to relegate the care of our spiritual needs to the bottom of the list. No doubt there are some who make it a regular habit to pray every day, but for those who are active and working, it is a little harder.

I was often inspired by my maternal grandmother, who in her latter years, kept a rosary at her place on the couch. I have also been inspired by various priests, like Msgr. Seamus McGowan, who is a very prayerful man himself and a fine example of someone who is spiritually grounded. I've also been edified by many people in the various parishes where I've been who come early to Mass and spend time in quiet prayer with the Lord.

Undoubtedly, most of you have some kind of prayer life, even if the daily concerns distract you from time to time. If there is one thing that characterizes our life as Christians, it is the very personal connection we have with our God through prayer.

The gospel this weekend highlights the theme of prayer. After Jesus had just finished a period of personal prayer, one of the disciples requested that Jesus teach them how to pray. They had been moved by the profundity of Jesus' communication with the Father, so the disciples expressed a longing to know how to pray as Jesus did. Jesus obliged the disciples' request by instructing them to pray the "Our Father".

The "Our Father" is a model prayer because it is the perfect prayer. In it, we find several nuggets that are important for us to reflect upon. I would like to focus on just a couple of those nuggets.

One of the first things we notice in the Lord's Prayer is that Jesus refers to God as Father. This is significant because it shows us a personal relationship. God isn't alienated from us in any way. Rather, he is very close to us and he loves us as a father. Our relationship with him is very close and intimate. So by calling God "Father", we are stating that he is our beloved.

At the same time, we acknowledge that our heavenly Father is holy. When we say, "hallowed be your name", we are not adding anything to the holiness of God. God is perfectly and sufficiently holy in and of himself. Rather, we are praying that God's name may be regarded with greater holiness within us. It expresses a desire on our part that we reverence the holiness of God in a fuller way.

Next, we ask in humility that His kingdom may come. This is a surrender to the will of God above all things. Where we often go astray in life is that we often try to impose our own will on things. In the end, this just leaves us miserable, especially when things don't go as we would expect.

The other thing to consider in the Lord's Prayer is that we pray, "Give us each day our daily bread." This is an interesting little portion of the gospel because the Greek text uses an interesting word. The typical word used for "daily" in Greek is hémera. In this passage from Luke, however, the Sacred Writer doesn't use the word hémera. Instead, he uses the phrase artos epiousios to say "daily bread". This is the only time the word epiousios appears in the scripture or in any other literature. The general thinking is that Luke (and Matthew) created this word because he wanted to say something specific. Certainly, we ask our heavenly Father to give us the necessary sustenance we need for each day. Interestingly though, the word epiousios means supersubstantial. Another way to put it is that it is a substance of a higher order. It is referring to the kind of bread that is above the ordinary order of substance. The inference we get is that we are asking for a bread on a higher substantial order on a daily basis. What is this bread of a higher order? It is easy to see this as the eucharistic bread. So in essence, we are asking that the Lord give us the Eucharist daily for our sustenance. There is something to be said for the daily reception of the Eucharist as necessary for our spiritual life.

In the following verses of the gospel, Jesus gives us a story about persistence in prayer. As I mentioned at the beginning, sometimes it is very difficult to persevere in prayer, especially when it seems that we are not receiving what it is we are asking for in prayer. We have to recognize that when it seems that God is not answering our persistent prayers, perhaps what God is doing is enlarging the space in our hearts for something even better than what we have been asking for. We are simply called to persevere and be persistent, knowing that what God is preparing us for is far greater than we can even imagine. Keep up the prayer!




