

Dear friends,

The words of the poet Robert Frost echo through this Sunday's readings:

The woods are lovely, dark and deep, But I have promises to keep, And miles to go before I sleep, And miles to go before I sleep.

In Frost's image, the traveler pauses in a place of beauty yet cannot stay—because a journey still stretches before him, filled with promises that demand faithfulness. This is precisely the vision the Scriptures give us today:

- In Wisdom, the people of Israel keep watch in the dark, holding onto God's promise of deliverance.
- In Hebrews, Abraham walks into the unknown, trusting the One who called him.
- In Luke, Jesus tells His followers to keep their lamps lit and their hearts awake, for the Master may arrive at any moment.

The Eastern Church Fathers often compared the Christian life to such a pilgrimage. St. Gregory of Nyssa wrote that we never truly "arrive" in this life, for God's beauty and love are infinite; we are always called onward. St. Basil the Great urged believers to stay ready, not from fear of punishment, but out of the joyful anticipation of meeting the bridegroom. And St. John Chrysostom reminded us that the faithful traveler sails on, guided not by the certainty of the map, but by the trustworthiness of the Divine Pilot. We can imitate the life of St. Josephine Bakhita in Walking the Unseen Miles.

St. Josephine Bakhita's life was a long road of faith through suffering. Born in Sudan in 1869, she was kidnapped as a child, sold into slavery, and passed through many hands. For years she had no control over her path—only the hope, deep within, that there must be a Master greater than the ones who beat her. When she encountered the Canossian Sisters in Italy, she discovered the One who had been walking with her all along: Jesus Christ. She was baptized in 1890, became a religious sister, and spent her life serving others with joy. Looking back, she could even say: "If I were to meet the slave traders who kidnapped me, I would kneel and kiss their hands. Because if that had not happened, I would not have become a Christian and a sister." Like Abraham, she left behind the familiar and set out on a road she could not see to its end. Like the servants in the Gospel, her lamp stayed lit—ready for the Lord's coming in every moment, until her final mile led her to eternal rest in 1947. From Scripture, the Eastern Fathers, the saints, and even our neighbors we learn that:

- Faith means trusting God's promises even in the dark.
- Watchfulness means keeping our hearts open to His presence every day.
- The journey is measured not in miles walked, but in love lived.



Blue Jay Families,

Our teachers and staff have dedicated the past several days to back-to-school training for the Diocese and at St. Pius X. It is truly inspiring to witness our schools unite in celebration of Mass as one body in Christ. On our first day, which we devoted to spiritual reflection, Sister Caritas reminded us to keep Jesus in our hearts as we begin each day and interact with one another. It can be easy to complain or become irritated, but taking the time to open our hearts and let Jesus guide us can transform our interactions. She encouraged us to engage in self-reflection whenever we feel frustrated. Imagine the positive impact we could have if we all practiced this virtue daily.

We also focused on our mission and vision, as well as our behavior management system, known as PAX (the Good Behavior Game). The term "PAX" is Latin for PEACE, and this program, developed and studied at Johns Hopkins University, is in its second year of implementation here. It has proven highly effective; any staff member can quiet the entire school in just a few seconds.

I would like to extend my gratitude to an anonymous donor who funded our Hallow membership. We had an extensive training session on Hallow, which serves as a valuable resource for both our staff and students, enriching our prayer life and enhancing our religion curriculum in numerous ways. Additionally, we received training on Magic School AI, safety protocols review from former Blue Jay Sergeant James Habeeb, and continued our Smart Families training in its second year. We are grateful for the opportunity to grow both professionally and spiritually. St. Pius X is a forward-thinking school that offers an abundance of resources for our students and staff, who are truly blessed.

I also want to thank another anonymous donor for funding an upgrade of our class set of Chromebooks this year. This upgrade was necessary as the previous technology had become outdated and would no longer receive updates.


We can't wait to welcome our students on the first day of school and have some special guests joining us! Come with bright smiles and positive energy—it's going to be a joyful morning!
