

Dear Friends,

On Monday of this past week, we celebrated the feast day of St. Clare of Assisi. According to tradition, she grew up in a wealthy family as the daughter of Count Favorino Schiffi, and a mother of noble origin.

When she was 18 years old, she attended a Lenten service at which St. Francis of Assisi was preaching. Inspired by his homily and his life of poverty and simplicity, she made the decision to leave behind her comfortable life and embraced the kind of life of poverty that Francis lived. She made her way to the chapel of Porziuncula where Francis and his fellow friars worshipped, and there he cut her hair and she took a plain robe and veil of a religious.

St. Francis then urged her to join a convent of Benedictine nuns. When Clare's father discovered this, he attempted to force her to return home, but she refused and stated that she would have no other husband than Jesus Christ. Eventually, Clare's widowed mother and her sister joined her at the convent until a separate dwelling was built for them next to the church of San Damiano. Slowly more women embraced the lifestyle of poverty for the sake of the kingdom and the Poor Clare's were born. They lived a life of austerity and contemplation.

I tell this story about St. Clare, because it is similar to the story of so many saints. Once they opened their hearts to follow the call of Christ, they encountered difficulty - even from their own families. Over the centuries, many of them defied parents, leaders, and other family members in order to answer the call of God and to serve him above all things.

What happened to them is exactly what Jesus describes in this weekend's gospel. He says: "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." He says, "a father will be divided against his son and a son against his father, a mother against her daughter and a daughter against her mother . . ." Jesus wants to convey that those who choose to follow him will experience heartache, division, and resistance.

Certainly, we find ourselves in similar circumstances. Trying to live according to the principles of Christian living often puts us at odds with the world around us. It even divides families, especially when we try to encourage our children to go to church and they choose not to. Or when we find that our spouse resists participating in church as well. People can often be stubborn.

Our calling is to remain steadfast in faith even in the greatest of opposition. As Christians, we also face ridicule and mockery for holding fast to the principles that God has set out for us. So many in society don't take kindly to Christian values and they often rebel against them. Everywhere we turn, people reject the morality of Christians, they fight against our pro-life stance, they dismiss any call to decency, and they rally against the dignity of marriage. Being Christian has its challenges.

It might be easier to give in and follow the crowd to avoid the uncomfortable nature of the situation, but that would mean compromising what we know to be true and living with a choice that goes contrary to our conscience.


you love me. Amen. (P 38)
