
Saint Pius X Catholic Church and School

Dear Parish Family,

On Thursday, August 21st, the Universal Church celebrated the Feast Day of St. Pius X, our patron. As is permissible whenever a parish celebrates the saint after which it is named, the feast may be celebrated as a solemnity at the weekend Masses nearest to the feast. Therefore, this weekend, we venerate St. Pius X.

St. Pius X stands as a monumental figure in the Church. His influence and legacy have left their mark on a number of aspects of our faith life throughout the past century. We don't have to look very far to see how our faith practice has been impacted by what he did during his pontificate.

One of his first major contributions was the implementation of a universal plan of catechetical instruction. During his priestly ministry, he noted how badly educated and ignorant so many of the faithful were with regard to a basic understanding of faith. So when he took the Petrine Office, he made it incumbent that all parishes in all dioceses around the world initiate programs of catechesis, particularly for the young people. So many of us growing up knew this as CCD (Confraternity of Christian doctrine). We now call it Religious Education or Faith Formation. So, the reason we have religious education programs for our children is directly attributable to Pope St. Pius X.

It is actually providential that we are celebrating Pius X's feast day during this time of year, since we are gearing up for our religious education programs. I would like to strongly urge all parents to register your children for our religious education programs so that they are not ignorant of the teachings of the Church. In his encyclical "Acerbo Nimis" (On Teaching Christian Doctrine), Pope Pius X lamented the fact that "The enemy has, indeed long been prowling about the fold and attacking it with such subtle cunning that now, more than ever before, the prediction of the Apostle to the elders of the Church of Ephesus seems to be verified: "I know that . . . fierce wolves will get in among you, and will not spare the flock." He rightly believed that humanity had gotten to the point that they rarely gave thought to God and that they know nothing of the Sacraments, nothing of eternal things, and nothing of morals. He stated that the "corruption of morals and depravity of life is already so great, and ever increasingly greater, not only among uncivilized peoples but even in those very nations that are called Christian."

We look at the society in which we live and we can't help but see the degradation of morals and the demise of civilized reaction to things. There is so much division and a dismissal of the virtues that give dignity to our lives. Our own day seems very similar to what Pope Pius X saw in his time. We should not neglect to provide our families a good faith formation and instill in them the basic practice of faith life in the home.

St. Pius X also wanted children at a younger age to be able to receive the benefit of the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist. He felt that, at a very young age, children could understand the concept of the Eucharist as being the very Flesh and Blood of Jesus Christ. Children have a natural craving for the Eucharist. I see it all the time in young faces as they come forward for a blessing during Communion time. They instinctively know that they want Christ. Every year, I find great

joy in seeing the faces of the children when they receive their First Communion. St. Pius understood that children needed the grace to receive this heavenly food to attach them to Christ.

Our patron, St. Pius X, also took a strong stance against what he called Modernism, which diluted the truths of scripture and contributed to relativism. The modernist theological trend tried to assimilate modern philosophies into Catholic Theology.

St. Pius X is a saint for our times. I've often been impressed with his writings and reflections. He wrote with great clarity and depth of meaning that is fruitful for meditation. It seems to me that we need cogent, clear teaching of the tenets of faith so that we can have a clear vision of how to grow in a deeper relationship with Christ and be able to set our sights on our eternal destiny. St. Pius X's motto was "To Restore All Things In Christ". Let's set about the task of restoring our spiritual lives and our relationship with the Lord and his Church.





Dear Blue Jay Families,



This celebration served as a beautiful reminder of the importance of our unity as a community. It also reminded me to find joy in our everyday moments. It was a privilege to see our students participate so reverently in the Mass. Following mass, our students enjoyed a memorable trip to Whataburger with Father Paul. The car ride alone was a joyful adventure! I am continually grateful for the laughter and love I get to share with our students in these simple, precious moments.

We have many exciting initiatives underway to enhance our school! Raffle tickets for the upcoming Halloween Carnival have arrived. Inside the building, you will find new café tables in the lunchroom and a new water fountain and bottle refill station. We are also progressing on several other projects, including the installation of a new scoreboard for our court.

We are incredibly grateful for the generous donations that have made the new scoreboard possible. To date, we have raised \$10,000. This includes a significant contribution of \$6,500 from Legamaro Financial, St. Pius X families (proceeds from the Rock, Paper, Scissors Battle), Gulf Coast Federal Credit Union, and Steve Tagliabue.

Due to unexpected installation costs, we still require approximately \$3,000 to place the order. The scoreboard takes about two months to arrive once ordered, and our goal is to have it installed before the basketball season begins in January. 
