Dear Friends,

At all the Masses last weekend, we celebrated the feast day of our patron, St. Pius X. It is a distinct privilege for us to be under the patronage of such a noble saint. He was the first pope of the 20th century, and he contributed so much to the spiritual well-being of the Universal Church. He is distinguished by the moniker, "Pope of the Eucharist" because he emphasized the importance of the Eucharist in the life of faith. The motto he chose for his papacy was: "To Restore All Things In Christ." In his desire to renew the Church, he set about implementing various reforms to the liturgy, as well as calling for the religious education of children and encouraging frequent reception of Holy Communion. He also did a revision of Canon Law - bringing together a hodgepodge of church laws that did not have the same cohesiveness that we have now. Needless to say, he is a wonderful spiritual inspiration for all of us, and he has had a lasting impact on the life of the Church.

Here at St. Pius X Parish, we have been doing some restoration efforts ourselves. Our focus of late has been working to restore a few physical aspects of our parish. When you go outside, look up. You will notice that the exterior of the church has been cleaned. Over the years, algae had been growing on the surfaces of the church building and bell tower as is typical of many structures in South Texas. Now that the algae has been removed, the church looks as though it has been repainted. It is nice to have a church fitting for worship of God. In the days ahead, we will be doing the same to some of our other buildings so that the entire property will be something we can be proud of.

In addition to the church exterior, we are going to be working on restoring and repairing the church doors, which have been battered by the elements throughout the past decade. The doors along St. Pius Drive are especially bad after the hard rain of Hurricane Harvey did a number on them several years ago. Our hope is that they will be much more attractive and easier to open once the restoration process is complete.

Soon, we should also have one of our church air conditioning units repaired. The unit that cools the back sections and the corridor of the church has had some issues for a while that we hope will soon be corrected. Additionally, we are scheduled to finally receive the HVAC units for the parish hall. The plan is for the long-awaited A/C units to be installed in October once the equipment finally is delivered. Please pray for this project as it will be a costly one.

The School will also be undergoing a few needed repairs to the foundation of the cafeteria, as well as new bird exclusion netting at the basketball court and the purchase of a new scoreboard. We are also upgrading the lighting on the court.

These are just a few of the things that we have in the works. You can expect to see some additional projects in the near future. With your generous stewardship many of these projects will be accomplished.




