
# Saint Pius X Catholic Church and School

Dear Friends,

Well, it's that time of year again! The first cool front is blowing through, signifying that cooler weather is on the way. Birds are migrating to their winter homes. Leaves will soon be dropping from the trees. Daylight hours are getting shorter and the lights of stadiums have started to pierce the darkness. You know what that means. Football season is here!

This is the time when you start seeing folks wearing their team jerseys and leaving behind their summer outdoor activities to start spending time in their recliners with beer in hand to arm-chair coach their team. The most ubiquitous fans are followers of the Dallas Cowboys. It doesn't matter how good or how bad they are. Cowboys fans are not fair-weather fans. It doesn't matter that they haven't won a Super Bowl title in decades. Cowboys fans are die-hard adherents, both in season and out of season.

There is a reason the Cowboys are called "America's Team". Their fans can be found all over the country and their logo is unmistakably recognizable anywhere. Even if you aren't a fan, you have to admire the people who follow the Cowboys. They have the character of faithfulness. They will not waver. Their hope in a fabulous season is ever present. They won't budge from their devotion to the team. They may grimace when a play goes awry or a bad call is made. They may criticize a player, or the decision of the coaches, but they don't falter in their commitment to the team. Even when someone ridicules them for their devotion, they never flinch.

There is a lot to be said for this kind of team fidelity. Though not everyone is a Cowboys fan, one can appreciate the fact that their fans are die-hard. If only we had the same kind of devotion as Christians!

When Jesus was making his way on this earth, he had developed quite a following. So many people came to him for healing. Many who came to him were elated with his message and were eager to join up and be his disciples. Recognizing their fickleness though, Jesus rather abruptly dampens their enthusiasm by challenging them. He isn't interested in gaining a large following merely based upon his own popularity. Many politicians and celebrities feed off this kind of thing. The reality check for them is that after time, they are no longer considered to be the fresh face on the block. Eventually, the star of celebrity fades and they find that their fans have moved on to the next thing.

Jesus doesn't want people to be under any illusion. The decision to follow him is going to require great fortitude and spiritual stamina. To follow him would involve a cost. In order to follow him, his disciples were going to need to think seriously about the implications of discipleship. He doesn't want his followers to act on the spur of the moment. He wants us to give careful consideration of what following him means. He doesn't want us to be disciples for only a season. He wants us to commit ourselves to him for a lifetime. That means we can't be fair-weather disciples. We have to be willing to embrace all the demands that come along with discipleship. Jesus then names the conditions. If we truly wish to follow him, we must be willing to carry our own cross each day. There will be certain things that we must let go

of. We must place Christ as supreme above all other things - even family.

Marriage is a great image of this. When a man and woman love each other and decide to get married, they must carefully consider what the consequences are. In marriage, there is undoubtedly going to be periods of great strain over differences of opinion and the monotony of daily life. There will be all kinds of disappointments, sacrifices, and crosses that are a part of that relationship of love. Yet, there will be moments of great joy. The perseverance through the rough patches brings fulfillment and peace. For whole-hearted love, there is no compromise. Likewise, following Christ is so valuable that it is worth stripping everything down to the bare essentials.

Following Christ necessitates the sacrifice of coming to Mass. It requires submitting ourselves to daily prayers. It involves following the requirements for the sacraments and obedience to things like going to confession or fasting during Lent, or practicing good stewardship. It requires standing up against persecution or holding fast to issues related to the preservation of life. It also means being willing, in some cases, to face death.

What are the costs of discipleship in your own life? Don't shy away from taking up your crosses and carrying them. Don't ever give up on Christ who will never give up on you!



Acutis. Carlo is a very relatable saint for our students. Born in 1991, he enjoyed football, Pokémon, action films, and his pets. He also had a strong Catholic faith that was the cornerstone of his life. He famously referred to the Eucharist as his "highway to Heaven," a devotion that led him to create a website documenting Eucharistic miracles that is still used today. It was the first of its kind.

As the first millennial to become a saint, he demonstrated that sanctity is attainable, even today. To celebrate this occasion, I invite all students to join me for a special reception in the teachers' lounge immediately following our School Mass this Sunday. We will enjoy light refreshments while learning more about Carlo's incredible journey.
