

Dear Friends,

If you've ever had to rent a car, you know that it requires a simple process of examining the condition of the car before you are given the keys and are able to drive off. Normally, the process involves walking around the car with the rental agent and notating any dents and scratches that are already on the vehicle. This is good for the renter and good for the rental agency.

The one renting will usually point out any defects or damage that may already be on the car for one reason: to assure that he or she doesn't get accused of doing damage done by previous renters. No one wants to be charged for something they didn't do.

The walk-around is also good for the agency because if upon returning the vehicle, some new damage appears that wasn't there previously, they can be pretty certain that it was damaged by the current renter. This enables them to recoup some money for damage to their vehicle.

For this reason, I sometimes find driving a rental to be a bit stressful. This was especially true some years ago when I was with a fellow priest driving a rental in Costa Rica while on vacation. I was dodging vehicles, potholes that could swallow a whole car, and avoiding big trucks on the highway. I was praying that nothing would happen to us, but also that nothing would happen to the car!

You might say that car rentals involve stewardship. The vehicle does not belong to us, so we strive to care for it and to use it well so that we can return it in good condition. This seems to me to be a wonderful analogy of the call to be good stewards of all the gifts that God has given us. This is particularly true of spiritual gifts. We may think that our house, our cars, and our possessions are ours and ours alone, but in the big picture, they all really belong to God. It is his providential care that enables us to possess things. Ultimately, all the things we have in life do not really belong to us. We are merely stewards of them.

We are stewards of our possessions, we are stewards of our pets, we are stewards of our property, we are stewards of our health, and so on. Everything is a gift from God, and he permits us to have a share in them. In the end, everything could be taken away in a flash. It is God who dictates what we ultimately are able to accumulate.

It is also true that we are stewards of our spiritual lives and our faith. God gave us the gift of faith. He gave us the ability to worship him and to utilize our capacities to make a difference in the lives of others. We will be accountable for how we use all that God has given us.

That's where the gospel points us to today. The gospel is the parable about the dishonest steward. He was caught squandering his master's property. He was using it for his own means of enrichment. Once he was discovered, he had to make an accounting for his actions.

Interestingly, Jesus eventually seems to compliment the steward for acting prudently so that he could save his skin.


