

Very early Monday morning, I will be departing for two weeks to lead a pilgrimage to Italy with a group of 46 pilgrims. The focus of the journey is the Jubilee Year of Hope. Every 25 years, the Church opens the holy doors at the major basilicas in Rome for pilgrims to pass through, symbolizing the opening of the doors of our hearts to Christ and his mercy. Our group will pass through the holy doors, and the highlight of the trip will be attending a Wednesday papal audience with Pope Leo XIV. During the journey, we will be praying for you, the parishioners of St. Pius X, especially as we visit the basilica in Venice where St. Pius X was Patriarch of Venice, and as we visit his tomb in St. Peter's Basilica. Know that I will bring you along in my heart.

From the Parochial Vicar:

Dear friends,

The United Nations tells us how wide the gap is between the rich and the poor: the richest 20% of the world's people use 86% of all goods and services, while millions of children die each day from hunger and malnutrition. At the same time, so much food is wasted in developed countries, enough to feed those very children. These numbers are just a small reflection of the deep inequality in our world today.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus gives us the parable of the rich man and Lazarus. It is the only parable where a character is given a name: Lazarus, which means "God is my help." The rich man lived in comfort, dressed in fine clothes, and dined lavishly every day. Lazarus, poor and sick, lay at his gate, longing for scraps. Yet the rich man never reached out to help him. Notice Jesus never condemned the man for being wealthy. His sin was not what he did but what he failed to do. He simply ignored Lazarus. His was the sin of omission. And so, when both died, Lazarus found comfort in God's presence, while the rich man suffered.

This is a powerful lesson for us. So often, we are glad that we haven't hurt anyone. But have we failed to help when we could? In Matthew 25, Jesus tells us that at the Last Judgment people will be condemned not for adding to others' suffering, but for neglecting to relieve it: "I was hungry, and you gave me no food; I was thirsty, and you gave me no drink; a stranger and you gave me no welcome." The truth is that our salvation is not only about avoiding sin but also about doing good. As St. Basil reminds us: "The bread you hold back belongs to the hungry; the coat you keep stored away belongs to the naked; the shoes gathering dust belong to those without shoes." At this time I do appreciate the concern and generosity for others of our St Pius Family from my own very personal experience as well as from the sharing of many.

Youth Ministry


Life Teen High School Ministry & Confirmation Sundays at 6:30pm Edge Middle School Ministry Wednesdays at 6:30pm

Recently, I've had the joy of spending time in our classrooms, particularly with our preschoolers.

It was a simple, powerful reminder of how important it is to give our whole hearts to whatever we are doing and to be truly present, whether in our work, as parents, or in our friendships.

This experience made me think of the ultimate example we have in Jesus. Throughout the Gospels, we see Him constantly surrounded by crowds, demands, and urgent tasks. Yet, He consistently treated each person and each moment with profound respect and attention. He was never too distracted to truly see the person in front of Him, whether it was a sick woman touching His cloak, a tax collector in a tree, or one of His disciples with a question. He was the perfect example to us, showing service. He showed us how to be fully present and attentive to the needs of others. He is the perfect role model for us in what it means to be a servant.

As I reflected on this in Adoration this week, I thought about all the distractions we have that pull us away from the important things we should focus on. Our phones, screens, extracurriculars, and even our good and busy work can steal our attention, pulling us away from our relationship with Christ, our families, and the important moments that matter most.

St. Paul wrote in Corinthians, "I am telling you this for your own benefit, not to impose a restraint upon you, but for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction" (I Corinthians 7:35).

I encourage you this week to take a quiet moment with the Lord and ask yourself: What is distracting me from what is truly important? Where is God inviting me to set aside the "many things" so I can choose the "better part" and be fully present to Him and to those He has placed in my life? Sometimes this can help us to just slow down and enjoy what is happening right in front of us. Don't miss the opportunity to dance with those little ones. God bless,
