

Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday, the Church throughout the world celebrates World Mission Sunday — a day to renew our awareness that we are missionary people sent by God to bring His love to all nations. At the heart of our faith lies a chain of divine promises:

- Jesus Christ is the Promise of the Father the Savior sent to redeem humanity.
- The Holy Spirit is the Promise of Jesus our Helper, Advocate, and the One who empowers the Church to continue Christ's mission.
- And all the children of the church are the promise and gift of God called to carry forward the saving mission of Jesus and the helping mission of the Holy Spirit in our world today.

The Mission of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit: From the beginning, God the Father desired that all creation be united in His love. Out of that love, He sent His Son — "not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him" (John 3:17). Jesus fulfilled this saving plan by preaching the Kingdom, healing the brokenhearted, forgiving sinners, and offering His life on the Cross. Before His Ascension, He promised another Helper: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you; and you shall be My witnesses" (Acts 1:8). The Holy Spirit now moves the Church — inspiring, strengthening, and sending us as witnesses of Christ's mercy.

The Church is Missionary by Her Very Nature: The Church Fathers remind us that the Church does not merely "have" a mission; she is mission. St. Augustine wrote, "The love of Christ, once kindled, cannot remain idle — it must share itself." St. John Chrysostom said, "There is nothing colder than a Christian who does not seek to save others." This missionary impulse springs from baptism itself. Every baptized person — not just priests and religious — is called to be a missionary disciple. Yet, priests, religious sisters and brothers, and lay missionaries make this calling visible by offering their whole lives in service to the Gospel. They are living signs that God's promise is still being fulfilled through human hearts that say "Yes."

Families are the First Mission Fields: Mission Sunday is also a time to reflect on the sacred role of families. Parents are the first witnesses of faith. Their sacramental marriage, fidelity, love, prayer, and example plant the seeds of vocation in the hearts of their children. When a young person says "yes" to priesthood or religious life, it is not only their "yes" — it is also the fruit of a family that has taught them to listen to God's voice. Pope St. John Paul II once said, "The family is the first and vital cell of society, the first school of social virtues, and the seedbed of vocations." When parents encourage their children to be open to God's call — whether as priests, religious, or committed lay faithful — they participate deeply in the Church's mission.

The Example of Missionaries: The world has been blessed with countless missionaries who gave everything for the sake of the Gospel - St. Francis Xavier, who left his homeland to bring Christ to India and Japan; St. Thérèse of the Child

Jesus, who, though she never left her convent, became the patroness of missions through her prayer and sacrifice; St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta, who brought the compassion of Christ to the poorest of the poor; and so many other saints and anonymous missionaries who, inspired by the Holy Spirit, still serve quietly in schools, hospitals, and parishes across the world. They remind us that every act of love, every prayer, and every offering made for the mission of the Church has eternal value.

We can share in this mission: 1. By Prayer: Like Moses in Sunday's first reading, lifting our hands in prayer sustains those on the front lines of evangelization. **2. By Generosity**: Supporting the Church's mission work helps build chapels, schools, and communities of faith in places where hope is scarce. 3. By Encouragement: We must nurture vocations — encouraging our children and youth to ask, "Lord, what do You want of me?" As Pope Francis reminded us, "We are all missionary disciples — called to bring the joy of the Gospel wherever we go." Finally, this is a mission of love: Mission is not about programs or travel — it is about love in action. Every parent who teaches a child to pray and instill in them from very childhood the culture of faith, every young person who chooses to live their faith with courage, every parishioner who supports the Church's outreach — all are part of God's great mission of love. Let us remember: Jesus is the Promise of the Father, the Holy Spirit is the Promise of Jesus, and our children are the promise of the future of the Church. May we help them discover the beauty of giving their lives for Christ — as priests, religious, missionaries, and faithful witnesses of the Gospel.

Let this be the prayer for this week: Lord Jesus, You are the Promise of the Father. Send us Your Holy Spirit, the Promise of Your love. Bless our children and youth with generous hearts, that they may continue Your saving mission in the world. Strengthen all missionaries, priests, and religious, and make every family a seedbed of faith and vocation. May God bless us to carry out His noble endeavor through us. Amen.

Respect Life Month – Pray the Rosary



School News

Blue Jay Families,



This week, my readings focused on a powerful and challenging message: the pursuit of excellence. I was struck by the common qualities shared by those who truly strive for it.

First, these people have joy in the success of others. When good things happen to someone else, they celebrate rather than compare. This is in contrast to the envy or jealousy that can so easily take root in our hearts. Where do you find yourself when you look at other people's successes?

Second, they are defined by a stellar work ethic. These individuals show up early, are reliable, take initiative without being asked, and consistently go above and beyond. Does this describe you, or is this something you strive for?

This reflection prompted me to consider excellence in a broader context across all areas of life. Our marriages, personal finances, physical fitness, spiritual health, careers, and family life. In Rediscover the Saints, Matthew Kelly encourages us to pursue this holistic excellence, noting on page 79 that "Saints are lovers of excellence." They are perpetual students, constantly learning more about God, humanity, and the spiritual practices that help them become the-best-version-of-themselves. Let us not settle for mediocrity. As Pope John Paul II urged us, "Do not be afraid". We can do all things through Christ who strengthens us. Philippians 4:13

But how do we build this life of excellence? The foundation is discipline. Kelly presents a compelling equation: Discipline = Happiness. He challenges us to take a close look at every facet of our lives, physical health, career, finances, friendships, marriage, parenting, and spiritual life, and see that each one requires intentional, disciplined effort.

For me, a practical starting point this year has been striving for excellence by guarding my speech. Kelly suggests that one of the most effective ways to grow in discipline is to control our tongues. He poses a simple but profound question: Can you keep a secret? This practice of mindful speech, found on page 28 of The Forgotten Way, is a keystone habit. When we learn to control our words, we often find it easier to control our tempers, our spending, and our reactions. It's a small, daily discipline that can affect every area of our lives, helping us build an excellent life. In closing, let us strive for excellence in every word and all that we do. We can remember the wisdom of St. James: "If anyone does not fall short in speech, he is a perfect man, able to bridle his whole body also." (James 3:2)


