
# Saint Pius X Catholic Church and School

## More than 60 years of faith "To restore all things in Christ"

Dear Friends,

Even though it has not even been a month, it seems as though I have been out of touch with all of you for a long time. At the end of September, I departed with a group of 46 other people on a pilgrimage to Italy for the Jubilee Year of Hope. I was only gone for two weeks, but when I returned, I promptly found myself in the throes of the dreaded Covid. That impeded me from celebrating Masses last weekend, and it also kept me out for another week while I recuperated. It is good to be "back in the saddle" now and back into the routine of parish life.

The pilgrimage was an eventful one, filled with a few challenges and many blessings. The itinerary was packed, and I have to admit it was rather exhausting. Even so, everything we did was very enriching and faith-building. There is something about walking the paths of saints that is inspiring. In Italy, there are many saints! Their stories evoked deep longings to imitate their holiness and reminded us that holiness is something we can all strive for. Not only did we visit the tombs of the likes of St. Mark the Evangelist, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Francis of Assisi, and St. Charles Borromeo, we also set our eyes upon St. Clare, St. Carlo Acutis, and Pope St. John Paul II. Moreover, we visited a number of places that have played a significant role in the life and history of the Church, including some associated with our patron, St. Pius X. We capped it all off by attending a general audience with Pope Leo XIV and passed through the holy doors at the four major basilicas of Rome.

To tangibly connect to the saints is a beautiful thing. Somehow, it makes them more real and not just some nebulous figure who lived a long time ago. That need for connection is one of the reasons the altar in virtually every church has a relic of a saint placed within it. It is also one of the reasons we have statues in our churches. The statues present the saints as someone tangible and real.

Here at St. Pius X, we have a connection with a Saint who was just canonized in Rome last Sunday. One of our dearly departed parishioners, Chispa Bluntzer, had the privilege of calling him "Uncle". Chispa was originally from Venezuela and was an institution here at St. Pius X.

Some time before her passing, she spoke to me very proudly of her uncle and was excited that the path was cleared for him to be named a Saint. His name is Dr. José Gregorio Hernández Cisneros, O.F.S. Though Chispa did not live to see the day of his canonization, I'm sure she was rejoicing in heaven at his being counted among the Saints.

St. José Gregorio was a Venezuelan physician and a member of the Third Order of St. Francis (a lay order of Franciscans). The eldest of seven children, he expressed a desire to go to law school, but his mother convinced him to study medicine. He tried on a couple of different occasions to study for the priesthood, but his delicate health forced him to withdraw from the seminary.

Once he became a doctor, he was highly esteemed and was renowned for his charitable nature. He dedicated his life to treating poor people free of charge. During the Spanish influenza epidemic of 1918, he worked selflessly, often buying medicines for the poor out of his own pocket. In June of 1919, while out trying to deliver medicine to treat an elderly person, he was struck by a car. As he was taken to the hospital, he died saying the name of Our Lady.

José Gregorio's love for the poor was very likely forged by his own physical infirmities. These helped him to develop a great compassion and love for the poor. His intimacy with the Lord came through prayer, which enabled him to see the dignity of those whom he served.

In reflecting on the gospel this weekend, we are called to consider the humility of the tax collector, who was very aware of his sinfulness. It was this disposition of humility that justified him in the sight of God. St. Jose Gregorio had cultivated humility in his heart and that enabled him to serve, not because it would be of benefit to him, but because it was the right thing to do out of love for God. Would that we all learned such lessons!








## School News
