

Dear Friends,

Last week, our school held its annual Halloween carnival. From the looks of it, we had a terrific turnout of school families, parishioners, and the general public. It was a fantastic evening that was a result of a lot of different people coming together to make it happen.

It is always fun to see all the different costumes that the kids wear and to see families enjoying the many features from the food, to the game booths, to the petting zoo. Sometimes people wonder if it is appropriate that we, as a Catholic Church, have a Halloween Carnival. After all, isn't Halloween associated with dark arts and superstition? To answer the question, I think it is important to start by reviewing what Halloween is and where it came from.

The name Halloween means All Hallows' Eve. It refers to the evening before the celebration honoring all the "Hallowed" or "Holy Ones". Essentially, it is the vigil on the evening prior to the great feast, All Saints Day. So originally, Halloween started as a Catholic celebration honoring or venerating the Saints of God. While some have erroneously connected Halloween to earlier pagan celebrations, it actually has prominent Catholic roots. The celebration remembers those who have gone before us and who share in the Eternal Light of heaven. Following upon All Saints, the Church celebrates All Souls, which commemorates the faithful departed and prays for the souls still in purgatory. These celebrations naturally cause us to think of our own mortality.

So, initially, there was nothing associated with ghosts, witches, sorcery, and the like. Sadly, the focus on mortality became more sinister and was corrupted by a secular culture where the ideas of superstition, sorcery and morbidity started to creep in.

As Catholics, we shouldn't be ashamed of the real meaning of Halloween. Instead, we should reclaim it for what it truly is: a celebration of the Saints in heaven and the prayers that we offer for All Souls. The innocent parts of the celebration, like Trick or Treating and the giving of candy should be the focus, while refraining from glamorizing anything involving superstition, witches, witchcraft, sorcery, or the occult. Opening the door to these more sinister things may seem fun and innocuous, but they can be dangerous to the soul. Dressing up in fun, lighthearted costumes, especially dressing as Saints, can be a good custom that maintains the character of the day.

This year, the Commemoration of All Souls has landed on Sunday. We are called to pray for the faithful departed and to intercede on their behalf that they might be well disposed to the purification that prepares them for heaven. Often, purgatory is viewed as a place of fire and suffering. It would be better if we think of purgatory as a state of purging where everything that is an obstacle to my receiving God's love is burned away by God's love. It is
