
# Saint Pius X Catholic Church and School

## More than 60 years of faith "To restore all things in Christ"

November 9, 2025



#### Dear Parishioners:

This weekend, we have another annual feast that uncommonly falls on a Sunday. Last Sunday, we celebrated the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day). This Sunday, it just so happens that we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. The question you may ask is: "Why do we celebrate the dedication of the Lateran Basilica?" The short answer is that the Lateran Basilica is the Mother Church of all the churches in the whole world! If it is the Mother Church of the world, then it makes sense that we honor it just as we would give due honor to our own local church.

Just last month, I had the pleasure of visiting the Lateran Basilica as part of the pilgrimage I led to Italy for the Year of Hope. It is a beautiful Cathedral and has a very storied history. I actually consider it to be one of my favorite churches in the Holy City. I find it particularly attractive because our own Corpus Christi Cathedral is loosely modeled after it. If you look at pictures of the apse (the semi-circular wall behind the altar), you can notice similarities between the two, with Christ in the center and a row of saints in the upper portion.

The Lateran Basilica is officially known as "The Cathedral of the Most Holy Savior and Saints John the Baptist and the Evangelist in Lateran". It is more commonly known simply as St. John Lateran. Apart from being named after Jesus our Savior, it is dedicated to the two Johns I mentioned above.

It is one of the most revered churches in the world because it was consecrated in the year 324. This was not long after Emperor Constantine issued a proclamation permitting Christians to worship freely and without threat of persecution. It is one of the most ancient churches and was one the first places Christians could worship in their newfound freedom. Imagine how exciting it must have been for those early Christians to be able to come out of hiding and worship freely and without fear.

The word Lateran comes from the Lateran Hill upon which it stands. The land was given to the emperor by the Laterani family who had a palace on that hill. Emperor Constantine had a church built upon this hill. This stood as the center of Christendom throughout the early centuries until the middle ages. The palace that exists next to the basilica was the residence of the popes throughout that time. You can imagine centuries of saints, church officials, and faithful passing through the halls where the Church's official business took place.

It wasn't until the middle ages when the pope moved to Avignon, France that the Cathedral fell into disuse. When the pope finally returned to Rome after decades, they gravitated toward St. Peter's Basilica and that became their residence when the palace was built there.

St. John Lateran is still considered to be the Mother Church of the world because it is the Cathedral of Rome. As the bishop of Rome, it is the Pope's Cathedral. It is called a Cathedral because it houses the chair of the Bishop of Rome.
