Dear Brothers and Sisters:

What are the things you do to get ready? Your answer to this question will likely depend on what it is you are getting ready for. If you are getting ready to go out to a formal dinner, for instance, you would likely prepare by getting your hair done, going shopping for the perfect outfit, washing up, putting on nice clothes and accessories, and making sure you look good in the mirror. If you are going on vacation, you probably prepare by spending days or weeks tying up loose ends at work, arranging for someone to take care of the family pets, pulling out the luggage, and packing and making sure the bills are paid. Or, if you are studying for an exam, you probably review your notes, meet with a study group, and possibly take a pre-exam. The process of readiness can look different in whatever circumstance we find ourselves in. What about getting ready for our ultimate destiny?

As another liturgical year draws to a close, the scriptures direct us toward the end of time and lead us to consider how prepared we are for eternal life. Jesus paints a kind of somber, foreboding image of the last things in the gospel this weekend. There is speak of wars, insurrections, and natural disasters in the words he says. He makes his disciples aware that there will be destruction and dissension everywhere. The disciples themselves will have to endure tensions,

persecutions, and opposition from all quarters. Despite all of this, he offers encouragement by informing them that not a hair on their head will be destroyed, and that they will encounter his help, which will enable them to persevere.

There is a familiar ring in the things Jesus describes that sound similar to the times we live in. It is not hard for us to believe that things are falling apart and that Jesus' words are coming true in our own day and age. The killing and oppression of Christians in various parts of the world, as well as the revolt against Christian principles, makes it seem as if the end times are unfolding before us. The disagreements that exist even within the Church are similarly distressing. Is this all a signal that the world will end soon? That is not for us to know.

One thing that is clear is that our state of readiness to meet the Lord depends upon our response to the call to the life of holiness.

Every day is an opportunity to evaluate how prepared we are. We don't want to be living in fear and trepidation, but we also don't want to be neglectful of our spiritual progress. That is why the Church gives us this period before we start another liturgical year, so we can refocus again on what is most important.

The degree to which we are ready for anything in our lives results in how much peace we are in. If I've done my due diligence to prepare for vacation, then I am more likely to enjoy my vacation free from worry. If I have prepared well for a night out, I will feel confident and self-assured so that I can enjoy the time with my friends. If I have given adequate study for an exam, it is more likely that I will be less anxious and more clear-headed. Likewise, if I am as ready as I can be for my eternal destiny, I can be at peace and reasonably free from anxiety.

What do we need to do to ready ourselves for Christ's coming? The answer is multifaceted. As with anything that relates to our soul, the first thing we need to do is pray. Prayer is divine communication with God. The habit of prayer forges a deep and intimate connection with God our Father. A regular life of prayer creates a habit of communication with God that solidifies that relationship. The more we pray, the more we want to pray. The closer we draw to God in prayer, the closer we want to be with God.

School News

Blue Jay Families,

I would like to take this opportunity to focus on the essential importance of our Catholic schools and the profound impact they have on our world today.



Recently, I had the privilege of listening to a webinar hosted by the University of Dallas titled, "The Catholic School Teacher," featuring Father Peter Stravinskas. His presentation centered on two critical components that merit our careful contemplation: I. Why Catholic Schools? and 2. What kind of teachers do we want in our schools? We firmly believe that parents are the primary educators of their children. Our Catholic schools serve as a vital and positive reinforcement, working in partnership with the home to share and uphold our shared values. Where parents plant the seeds of faith, our schools provide the constant nourishment necessary for that faith to fully blossom. This mission defines our teachers' vocation. They are called to teach as Jesus did, allowing Christ to enter their lives completely and constantly pursuing their spiritual and professional formation. They must be witnesses of a strong, shared faith, united by the ultimate goal: to make saints of all our students.

The historical perspective on Catholic education is fascinating. As I was recently reminded in this webinar, Pope Pius XI had a powerful opinion on the necessity of Catholic schools, asserting that removing religion from the classroom does not create a "neutral" education. Rather, it inadvertently trains the student to live as if God does not matter or does not exist. It is a powerful reminder that, at one time, it was even stipulated in Canon Law that all Catholic families were obliged to ensure their children received a Catholic education. Wow!

This daily commitment often involves a significant sacrifice for many families, raising the critical question: What about those who cannot afford the tuition? We are working toward a future where Catholic education is accessible to all. I am encouraged by the imminent implementation of state and federal programs designed to lower this financial barrier:

- Texas Education Savings Accounts (ESAs): The new Education Savings Accounts (like the TEFA program) are a monumental step. I pray that as our legislators see the high demand for this kind of educational choice, the program will eventually be opened universally, as it is in other states, allowing all families the eventual access to these critical funds.
- Federal Tax Credit: The recently passed Federal Tax Credit will further assist in making tuition more affordable

by encouraging donations to scholarship-granting organizations.

We are closer than ever to ensuring Catholic education is available to every child who desires it, providing them the opportunity to live their faith fully throughout the school day.

I personally witness daily the enrichment and blessings our Catholic schools pour into our families. The "why" of Catholic education is best demonstrated by the faith lived out by our students. This year, our 5thgrade students sent prayer cards to individuals needing support—an act of Corporal Mercy taught by Mrs. Stovall and extended to hundreds of students over the years. In this week's bulletin, you will find a heartfelt letter from a man who was compelled to write back after receiving one of these cards. This profound moment of connection, compassion, and living faith is our "why." This is why our Catholic Schools are essential. I hope you enjoy that letter as much as I did.

Finally, as we approach the Christmas season, please do not forget the incredible sacrifice of our dedicated teachers. They are the heart and soul of our mission. Our teachers make approximately 40% less than their public
