Today, I would like to reflect on a couple of significant themes. The first is the theme of this weekend's celebration – Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe. The second theme is related to what we will be celebrating in a few days – Thanksgiving. It seems to me that both have a correlation to each other.


As we draw the liturgical year to a close with this celebration of Christ the King, we round out what we have been reflecting on for days. The readings for the past few weeks have drawn our attention to the last things and the ultimate orientation of our lives, which is to be found worthy of the heavenly reward. Recent readings have highlighted the need for us to be prepared and to not squander the time we have been given on this earth. The emphasis these weeks has been on making good use of our lives and living purposefully while here on earth, so that we may dwell eternally in heaven.

The only way for us to live a purposeful life is to not live for ourselves, but to live for Christ. This is the only way to find meaning in life. Anything else will leave us wanting. When we lose sight of Christ, we lose everything. The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, reminds us that there is only one King in our lives. So often, we

get wrapped up in ourselves and our own creature comforts. The danger of a consumeristic society is that we become too comfortable with our own comfort. More often than not, this leads to us focusing less attention on the good of our soul, and more attention on the good of our body. When we indulge in all the carnal pleasures, we obscure that which belongs to the higher order - the salvation of our soul. Our spiritual self takes a back seat to the satisfaction of our baser desires. Christ then is no longer king of our lives. Instead of serving him, we serve ourselves.

Serving ourselves leads to alienation from others. Before we know it, we have become lonely and devoid of any meaningful relationships The soul becomes hungry for something more. It craves communion. It yearns for God.

This past week, some news reports revealed that there were 52 students kidnapped or taken from a Catholic School in Nigeria. There

has been an increasing persecution and oppression of Christians there. Those who perpetrate these offenses against the rights and dignity of the Christian people are attempting to eliminate what they perceive as a threat to their ability to maintain power. Christianity promotes freedom and respect, which is a threat to those who desire power. So, those in power work to rid themselves of the threat. What those in power don't see is that their actions only serve to ignite the flame of faith in people and embolden them to greater fidelity to their beliefs. Persecution does not discourage Christian belief. Rather, it sparks a realization that bodily safety is not as important as those principles that lie within. Those persecuted cling more readily to Christ and allow him greater reign over their lives. They do not fear death or bodily harm because Christ already has sovereignty over their hearts. Notice how the killing of someone who stands firm in faith ignites courage in others to give witness. This is what is happening in Nigeria. Rather than diminishing the faithful, the Church is growing there.

We all must live for Christ. We need to recognize that he is indeed our King. When we see that Christ is King of our lives, we begin to see that all things are owed to him. This is where the theme of Thanksgiving comes into play. If Christ is our King, then we see that our King looks after our needs and has gifted us with everything we have. It is only right


