Dear Beloved Parishioners:

The joy of receiving gifts and the excitement of gathering with family and friends leave lasting marks on our souls. Of course, it isn't all about gifts and food. Something else leaves a more profound imprint upon us - the celebration of the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

While all of the other aspects of Christmas contribute to the overall joy of the season, the inescapable fact of the Word becoming flesh gives this day its true meaning. We have all heard the saying: "Jesus is the reason for the season". We have also heard the slogan "Keep Christ in Christmas!" This mystery is so pivotal that all time began to be recorded in a different way. When Christ was born, time began to be measured by his coming. We call it Anno Domini or "A.D". This means "The year of the Lord". When Christ was born, we recognized that our existence was so impacted by his birth that every moment was counted in reference to Him. Our whole universe was transformed by his arrival.

This year we celebrate 2,025 years of dwelling in the light of our Lord. Indeed, his arrival did bring light to a world darkened by sin. His dawning brought hope to humanity, and it is his light that governs all things. There is absolutely nothing that can overcome the light of Christ. Evil no longer has reign. In Christ, darkness flees. The lighting of our homes and our trees represents his light coming into the world.
